1	Senate Resolution
2	A resolution recognizing the fourth Wednesday in
3	February as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness
4	Day" in Florida and encouraging efforts to educate
5	people about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.

7	WHEREAS, hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM) is a chronic
8	cardiac disease involving the thickening of the heart muscle
9	which can potentially lead to debilitating symptoms and serious
10	complications, including heart failure, atrial fibrillation,
11	stroke, and, in rare cases, sudden cardiac death, and
12	WHEREAS, HCM is the most common inheritable heart disease
13	and can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or ethnicity,
14	with a reported prevalence ranging from 1 in 500 to 1 in 200 in
15	the general population, and
16	WHEREAS, an estimated 700,000 to 1,650,000 people in the
17	United States have HCM, yet 85 percent of them are projected to
18	remain undiagnosed, and
19	WHEREAS, HCM shares symptoms with other common
20	cardiovascular and pulmonary diseases, such as shortness of
21	breath, chest pain, fatigue, palpitations, and fainting, making
22	it difficult to distinguish HCM from these other diseases, and
23	WHEREAS, left untreated, all-cause mortality risk is three
24	to four times higher in patients with HCM than that of the
25	general population, and
26	WHEREAS, an important first step in receiving an accurate
27	diagnosis of HCM is knowing one's medical history and any signs
28	and symptoms of HCM, and
29	WHEREAS, to help identify a risk of cardiac disorders, both
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30	genetic and congenital, a health care provider must first
31	conduct a thorough screening with cardiac health questions, and
32	WHEREAS, after such screening, the health care provider may
33	also conduct several tests, including an echocardiogram, a
34	cardiac MRI, or genetic testing, to confirm a family history of
35	HCM, but must examine the heart to diagnose HCM in a patient,
36	and
37	WHEREAS, following a diagnosis of HCM, it is important for
38	patients to work with their health care provider to learn more
39	about their disease and understand different management options,
40	including prescription medicines and surgical treatment options
41	that may help, and
42	WHEREAS, HCM awareness is critically important in improving
43	Floridians' cardiovascular health, NOW, THEREFORE,
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45	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:
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47	That the fourth Wednesday in February of each year is
48	recognized as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" in
49	Florida.
50	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Florida Senate supports
51	raising awareness of the consequences of undiagnosed and
52	untreated hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM) as a serious public
53	health issue and of the need for individuals to seek appropriate
54	care for HCM.
55	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Florida Senate shall
56	annually issue a proclamation recognizing the fourth Wednesday
57	in February as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" in
58	Florida and calls upon the people of Florida to observe the day

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
