A bill to be entitled

An act relating to citizen's arrest; creating s.

901.001, F.S.; abrogating the common-law remedy of,
and prohibiting, citizen's arrests; providing
exceptions; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 901.001, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

901.001 Citizen's arrest.

- (1) It is the intent of the Legislature to abrogate any common-law remedy of citizen's arrest. A private person who is not a law enforcement officer, as defined in s. 943.10(1), may not arrest another person for a violation of the laws of this state.
 - (2) This section does not apply to:
- (a) A person who is a law enforcement officer, as defined in s. 943.10(1), who is acting outside of his or her jurisdiction. Such an officer may arrest a person who commits a felony in his or her presence or arrest a person when a felony has been committed and when the arresting officer has probable cause to believe, and does believe, that the person he or she arrested committed the felony.
- (b) A person who detains, without use of deadly force, a person who has illegally entered his or her dwelling, vehicle, or vessel until the arrival of a law enforcement officer.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
