25		satisfactorily pass a medical evaluation each year before		
26		participating in interscholastic athletic competition or		
27		engaging in any practice, tryout, workout, conditioning, or		
28		other physical activity associated with the student's candidacy		
29		for an interscholastic athletic team, including activities that		
30		occur outside of the school year. Such medical evaluation may be		
31		administered only by a practitioner licensed under chapter 458,		
32		chapter 459, chapter 460, or s. 464.012 or registered under s.		
33		464.0123, or a practitioner who holds an active equivalent		
34		licensure issued by the state in which the medical evaluation is		
35		performed, and in good standing with the practitioner's		
36		regulatory board. The electrocardiogram required under		
37		subparagraph 4. shall be administered in accordance with

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39 <u>Committee. An electrocardiogram completed up to 2 years prior to</u> 40 the 2026-2027 school year satisfies this requirement.

41 <u>2.</u> The <u>FHSAA</u> bylaws <u>must</u> shall establish requirements for 42 eliciting a student's medical history and performing the medical 43 evaluation <u>and electrocardiogram</u> required under this paragraph, 44 which shall include a physical assessment of the student's 45 physical capabilities to participate in interscholastic athletic 46 competition as contained in a uniform preparticipation physical 47 evaluation and history form. The evaluation form must: shall

48 <u>a.</u> Incorporate the recommendations of the American Heart
49 Association for participation cardiovascular screening.

50 b. and shall Provide a place for the signature of the 51 practitioner performing the evaluation with an attestation that 52 each examination procedure listed on the form was performed by 53 the practitioner or by someone under the direct supervision of 54 the practitioner. The form must shall also contain a place for 55 the practitioner to indicate whether $\frac{if}{if}$ a referral to another 56 practitioner was made in lieu of completion of a certain 57 examination procedure. The form must shall provide a place for 58 the practitioner to whom the student was referred to complete 59 the remaining sections and attest to that portion of the 60 examination.

<u>c.</u> The preparticipation physical evaluation form shall
Advise students to complete a cardiovascular assessment and
<u>electrocardiogram</u>, shall include information concerning
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64 alternative cardiovascular evaluation and diagnostic tests, and 65 require the. results of such medical evaluation to must be 66 provided to the school.

A student is not eligible to participate, as provided in s. 1006.15(3), in any interscholastic athletic competition or engage in any practice, tryout, workout, or other physical activity associated with the student's candidacy for an interscholastic athletic team until the results of the medical evaluation have been received and approved by the school.

A. Beginning in the 2026-2027 school year and thereafter, the first time a student who is in grades 9 through 12 participates in an interscholastic athletic competition or is a candidate for an interscholastic athletic team, he or she shall complete at least one electrocardiogram screening that meets the requirements of s. 1006.165.

79 Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c), a (d) 80 student shall be granted an exception to the electrocardiogram 81 requirement if the parent of the student objects in writing to 82 the student receiving an electrocardiogram because the 83 electrocardiogram is contrary to his or her religious tenets or 84 practices or if a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 in good standing with the Board of Medicine or Board 85 of Osteopathic Medicine, as applicable, provides a certificate 86 of medical exception. 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89 interscholastic athletic team if the parent of the student 90 objects in writing to the student undergoing a medical 91 evaluation because such evaluation is contrary to his or her 92 religious tenets or practices. However, in such case of any such 93 exception or objection, there shall be no liability on the part 94 of any person or entity in a position to otherwise rely on the 95 results of such medical evaluation or electrocardiogram for any 96 damages resulting from the student's injury or death arising 97 directly from the student's participation in interscholastic athletics where an undisclosed medical condition that would have 98 99 been revealed in the medical evaluation or electrocardiogram is 100 a proximate cause of the injury or death.

101 The FHSAA shall adopt bylaws or policies that prohibit (n) 102 a student athlete who receives an abnormal electrocardiogram 103 result from participating in tryouts, practice, or competition 104 until the student submits to the school a written medical 105 clearance to participate. Medical clearance must be authorized 106 by an appropriate health care practitioner listed in 107 subparagraph (c)1. who is trained in the diagnosis, evaluation, 108 and management of electrocardiograms. There shall be no 109 liability on the part of a school district in a position to 110 otherwise rely on the results of the electrocardiogram and medical clearance for any damages resulting from the student's 111 injury or death arising from a cardiac event due to the 112 student's participation in interscholastic athletics. 113 279473
