11	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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13	Section 1. Statewide pawn data database feasibility study
14	(1) As used in this section, the term:
15	(a) "Department" means the Department of Law Enforcement.
16	(b) "Pawn data" means information related to the
17	transactions of secondhand dealers and secondary metals
18	recyclers, including pawn shops, which is required by chapters
19	538 and 539, Florida Statutes, to be reported electronically to
20	law enforcement officials. The term includes, but is not limited
21	to, descriptions of property, seller information, transaction
22	dates, and any other data related to the exchange of goods.
23	(2) The department shall conduct a feasibility study
24	regarding the creation of a statewide pawn data database which,
25	at a minimum, must:
26	(a) Allow law enforcement agencies in all counties in this
27	state to access, update, and share pawn data in real-time.
28	(b) Be provided free of charge to all law enforcement
29	agencies in this state.

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30	(c) Be interoperable with different law enforcement
31	databases, software solutions, and jurisdictions and meet
32	established data standards to facilitate seamless communication
33	between law enforcement agencies.
34	(d) Ensure compliance with applicable privacy and security
35	laws.
36	(3) By January 1, 2026, the department shall report to the
37	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
38	Representatives the results of the feasibility study.
39	(4) This section is repealed upon submission of the report
40	required under subsection (3).
41	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
