School districts that wish to participate in the 45 (b) 46 tutoring program must recruit, train, and deploy eligible high 47 school students using the materials developed under this 48 section. Tutoring must occur during or after the school day on 49 school district property in the presence and under the 50 supervision of instructional personnel who are school district 51 employees. A parent must give written permission for his or her 52 child to receive tutoring through the program.
