 2 An act relating to trespass at large scale ticketed
 3 events; amending s. 810.08, F.S.; providing enhanced
 4 criminal penalties for trespass that occurs in a
 5 structure being used for a ticketed event where
 6 attendance exceeds a specified number; amending s.
 7 921.0022, F.S.; conforming provisions to changes made
 8 by the act; providing an effective date.

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 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 12 **Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section**
 13 **810.08, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (d), a**
 14 **new paragraph (c) is added to that subsection, and subsection**
 15 **(1) of that section is republished, to read::**

16 810.08 Trespass in structure or conveyance.—

17 (1) Whoever, without being authorized, licensed, or
 18 invited, willfully enters or remains in any structure or
 19 conveyance, or, having been authorized, licensed, or invited, is
 20 warned by the owner or lessee of the premises, or by a person
 21 authorized by the owner or lessee, to depart and refuses to do
 22 so, commits the offense of trespass in a structure or
 23 conveyance.

25 (c) If the offense occurs in a structure being used for a

26 large scale ticketed event where attendance exceeds 5,000
 27 persons, the trespass in a structure or conveyance is a felony
 28 of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.
 29 775.083, or s. 775.084.
