25	(1) A person may not impersonate a transportation network
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26	company driver, as defined in s. 627.748(1), by making a false
27	statement; displaying counterfeit signage or emblems of a trade
28	dress, trademark, brand, or logo of a transportation network
29	company; or engaging in any other act that falsely represents
30	that the person represents a transportation network company or
31	is responding to a passenger ride request for a transportation
32	network company.
33	(2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), a person who
34	willfully violates subsection (1) commits a misdemeanor of the
35	second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.
36	775.083.
37	(b) A person who willfully violates subsection (1) during
38	the commission of, or to facilitate the commission of, a
39	separate felony offense commits a felony of the third degree,
40	punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

59	service standards as established by the commission, to ensure

71	transportation network company as defined in s. 627.748(1).
72	(2) For contracts entered into or renewed on or after
73	October 1, 2024, a transportation service provider must agree
74	to:
75	(a) Provide <del>training to</del> each driver of a motor vehicle
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76	used to provide paratransit service to persons with disabilities
77	with access to third-party training materials which, at a
78	minimum, meet meets requirements established by the Agency for
79	Persons with Disabilities for training and professional
80	development of staff providing direct services to clients of the
81	agency.
