Amendment

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Remove lines 63-127 and insert:

(a) Before providing services to an eligible relative, a home health aide for medically fragile children must complete an agency approved training program. The employing home health agency must provide validation of competency by a registered nurse, and maintain documentation of training completion and competency validation. The employing home health agency must provide additional training and competency validation as the medically fragile child's care needs change and consistent with any changes to the plan of care. The employing home health agency must provide training on HIV infections and AIDS and must

18	holds and maintains a certification in cardiopulmonary
19	resuscitation.
20	$\overline{\text{(b)}}$ The agency, in consultation with the Board of
21	Nursing, shall approve home health aide for medically fragile
22	children training programs developed by home health agencies in

25	fragile children to increase the health care provider workforce
