## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 309 and 310

insert:

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Section 9. Section 1001.93, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1001.93 Offices of Public policy events within the State University System.-

(1) The Legislature finds that the advancement of knowledge is the fundamental purpose of the State University System and that such advancement is facilitated by the fearless sifting and

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12 winnowing of a wide diversity of views and that the open 13 discussion and debate of contested public policy issues from 14 diverse perspectives provides essential preparation for mature 15 citizenship and an informed exercise of the right to vote.

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(2) For purposes of this section, the term:

(a) "Debate" means an event at which two or more participants speak in favor of opposing approaches to the same public policy dispute, after which each participant is allotted time to address and rebut the position presented by the opposing speakers.

(b) "Group forum" means an event at which two or more speakers address a public policy dispute from divergent or opposing perspectives, after which each participant is allotted time to address questions from the audience and to comment on the other speakers' positions.

(3) Each state university within the State University System must have an Office of Public Policy Events and must appoint a Director of Public Policy Events who is responsible for the duties and reporting responsibilities of the office. The office must, at a minimum:

(a) 1. Organize, publicize, and stage debates or group 32 33 forums at the state university. These events must address, from 34 multiple, divergent, and opposing perspectives, an extensive 35 range of public policy issues widely discussed and debated in 36 society at large. Each such The university shall sponsor no less 37 than four events each academic year. At least two events must 38 occur during the fall semester and at least two events must 39 occur during the spring semester.

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1.2. Such debates and group forums must include speakers

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41 who represent widely held views on opposing sides of the most 42 widely discussed public policy issues of the day and who hold a 43 wide diversity of perspectives from within and outside of the 44 state university community.

2.3. If <u>a state university</u> the office is unable to readily find an advocate from within the state university community who is well-versed in a perspective, <u>as required in subparagraph 1.</u>, the <u>state university must</u> office shall invite a speaker who is able to represent such perspective. The <u>state university may</u> <u>reimburse</u> office shall, when necessary, provide such speakers who are not from within the state university community with per diem and a reimbursement for travel expenses <u>and per diem</u>.

53 (b) Maintain on its website a permanent, publicly 54 accessible listing of all of the events sponsored by the state 55 university during the prior and current academic year  $\tau$ 56 searchable, and up-to-date calendar in print, on the office's 57 website, and on the state university's website listing all of the events sponsored by the office and all other debates, group 58 59 forums, and events open to the entire campus community at the 60 state university that address public policy issues. The calendar 61 must itemize the title of the event; the name and institutional 62 affiliation of the speaker or speakers; and the office, 63 institute, department, program, or organization that sponsored 64 the event, excluding those events sponsored by off-campus groups 65 in rented state university facilities. Such calendars must be 66 kept in the library system of each state university. 67 (c) Beginning September 1, 2024, and annually each

68 September 1 thereafter, provide to the Board of Governors a 69 report, which must reflect prior academic year statistics,

83	(d) Make publicly available, in an online format, a
84	complete video <u>recording</u> <del>record</del> of every debate and group forum
85	organized by the state university office. The video recording
86	for an event organized by the <u>state university</u> office must be
87	posted on the <u>state university's</u> <del>office's</del> website within 10
88	business days after the event. Such video must remain publicly
89	accessible on the <u>state university's</u> <del>office's</del> website for at
90	least <u>1 year</u> <del>5 years</del> after the date of the event. Such videos
91	must also be permanently preserved within, and made available to
92	the public through, the library of the state university that
93	hosted the event.
94	(4) <del>Upon approval of the board of trustees of the state</del>
95	university and the Board of Governors, a state university may
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96 assign the duties of the office to an existing administrative office within the state university rather than establish a separate office.

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99	(5) Each office shall report directly to either the state
100	university's office that is responsible for compiling and
101	reporting the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System's
102	graduation rate survey or Office of General Counsel.

104	(3) by the office must be open to all students, faculty, and
105	staff of the state university and, unless restricting attendance
106	to such event is necessary to achieve a compelling governmental
