By July 1, 2026, the instructional day for middle 29 schools may not begin earlier than 8 a.m. and the instructional 30 day for high schools may not begin earlier than 8:30 a.m. Each district school board must inform its community, including 31 32 parents, students, teachers, school administrators, athletic 33 coaches, and other stakeholders, about the health, safety, and academic impacts of sleep deprivation on middle school and high 34 school students and the benefits of a later school start time 35 36 and discuss local strategies to successfully implement the later 37 school start times.
