(b) A general permit is granted for the replacement of an 20 21 existing onsite sewage treatment and disposal system, otherwise subject to s. 381.0065, with a DWTS if the DWTU and DWTS are 22 23 commonly owned and operated by the permittee. Pursuant to obtaining this permit, the installation of each DWTU may proceed 24 25 without further action by the department if the permittee 26 submits a notification to the department at least 30 days before 27 installation. Such notification must certify that a Florida 28 registered professional designed the DWTU in accordance with 29 applicable rules adopted pursuant to this chapter and that the 30 proposed DWTU meets all of the following requirements: 1. The design capacity of the DWTU does not exceed 10,000 31 32 gallons per day of domestic wastewater or 5,000 gallons per day 33 of commercial wastewater. 34 2. The DWTU may discharge without disinfection into a 35 slow-rate subsurface application system designed and operated to 36 protect public health and safety and maintain the current 37 separation, and in no case has less than 12 inches of separation, between the bottom surface of the drainfield and the 38 39 water table elevation at the wettest season of the year. 40 3.
