A bill to be entitled

An act relating to performance reports of circuit and county court judges; providing a short title; creating s. 28.51, F.S.; requiring each clerk of the circuit court to prepare an annual performance report with specified information regarding each circuit and county court judge; defining the term "final disposition"; requiring such reports to be posted by a certain date on specified websites; requiring such reports to remain posted for a specified time period; authorizing judges to prepare a specified explanatory statement; requiring such statements to be posted with the relevant reports in certain circumstances; providing for a specified reporting period; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Judicial Efficiency and Transparency (JET) Act."
- Section 2. Section 28.51, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 28.51 Performance reports of circuit and county court judges.—
- (1) Each clerk of the circuit court shall prepare an annual performance report regarding the judicial efficiency of each circuit and county court judge in this state. The report shall detail the judicial activities during the preceding calendar year and contain, but need not be limited to, the following

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information, all of which shall be separated by court division:

- (a) The number of cases assigned to each judge.
- (b) The number of cases that have reached final disposition. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "final disposition" means the rendering of a decision or a judgment by a judge in a judicial proceeding in which a case is finally determined by adjudication, dismissal, or other final disposition.
- (c) The clearance rate, stated as the total percentage of cases filed during each reporting period which were disposed of.
- (d) The average length of all active pending cases, measured as the number of days from filing until the end of each reporting period.
- (e) The number of civil cases assigned to each judge, except civil cases placed on inactive status, pending for 3 years or more, measured from the filing of a complaint or other filing initiating a case until the end of each reporting period.
- (f) The average number of days, beginning on the date a hearing is scheduled and ending on the date the hearing is held, for each hearing held in each reporting period.
- (2) On or before April 1 of each year, each report shall be posted on the website of the clerk of the circuit court, as applicable, and on the website of each circuit and county court and shall remain posted for the duration of the tenure of the subject judge.
- (3) A judge may prepare an explanatory statement detailing the basis for any extenuating circumstance that the judge believes impacts the metrics reported pursuant to this section.

  Upon approval of the chief judge of each circuit, the
