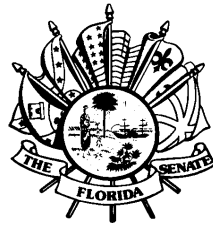

SB 1082 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Expunged or Sealed Criminal Records; expands list of offenses that cannot be expunged or sealed from criminal history records to include offenses that meet statutory criteria of sexual predator, sexual offender, & career offender designation. Amends 943.0585,.059. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 1098 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, Senator Fasano and others—

Armed Forces/Reserves/National Guard; prohibits landlord from discriminating against member in offering dwelling unit or in any terms of rental agreement; requires granting of leave of absence for state, county, & municipal officials who are members of National Guard or reserve component of Armed Forces; provides conditions under which member may terminate his or her retail installment contract for leasing motor vehicle, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Hospice License Plate; creates said license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

SB 1162 (2R) by Senator Pruitt—

Taxation; abrogates repeal of laws re tourist development tax & Florida Taxpayer's Bill of Rights notwithstanding repeal scheduled under specified provision. Revives & reenacts 125.0104(7); revives & readopts 192.0105. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Private Property Rights Protection; amends "Bert J. Harris, Jr., Private Property Rights Protection Act"; provides for state land planning agency to receive notice of claims; amends procedures for determining governmental entity's final decision identifying allowable uses for property; provides that enactment of law or adoption of regulation does not constitute applying law or regulation; provides for waiver of sovereign immunity for liability. Tourism; increases membership of Fla. SB 1490 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Pari-mutuel Wagering; revises criteria for making breeders' awards for racehorses; provides for payment of special racing awards; authorizes thoroughbred racing permitholder to operate cardroom; redefines term "authorized game"; provides requirements for harness permitholder to operate cardroom; revises certain restrictions on hours that cardroom may be operated; authorizes cardroom operator to limit amount wagered, etc. Amends 550.26165, .2625, .5251, 849.086. FDLE/Blood Collecting; requires that each sex offender placed on probation or community control submit approved biological specimen to be registered with DNA data bank; requires that, in addition to blood specimen, approved biological specimen be collected from person convicted of specified offenses who is incarcerated or in custody of Juvenile Justice Dept.; provides for collection of specimens, etc. Amends 943.325, 948.03. SB 1696 (2R) by Senator Posey and others—

Repeals 212.031(9). Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Road Designation/Gadsden County; designates portion of State Road 63 in Gadsden County as "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Highway"; provides for erection of signs. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

CS/SB 1958 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Bullard—

Road Designations/Miami-Dade Co.; designates Steven Cranman Boulevard, Ethel Beckford Boulevard, Phicol Williams Boulevard, Arthur Mays Boulevard, & Judge Steve Levine Boulevard in Miami-Dade Co.; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

CS/SB 1986 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Sebesta—

Public Construction Bonds; provides for mandatory form for public construction bonds. Amends 255.05. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 2082 (2R) by Senator Webster—

Saboor Grieving Parents Act; provides popular name of "Stephanie Saboor Grieving Parents Act"; provides that where health practitioner or facility has custody of fetal remains following spontaneous fetal demise, health practitioner or facility must notify mother of her option of burial or cremation of fetal remains; directs Health Dept. to develop forms for health practitioners; directs AHCA to develop forms for facilities. Creates 383.33625. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 2130 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Sebesta—

SB 2214 (2R) by Senator Jones—

Intestate Succession; extends intestate succession to paternal & maternal great-grandparents, great-great-grandparents & other descendants. Amends 732.103. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2310 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Crist—

On-Line Pharmacy; requires on-line pharmacy to have written prescription from practitioner licensed by this state before selling or dispensing controlled substance to person residing in this state; provides for facsimile transmission & verification of such prescription; requires on-line pharmacies to obtain permit to operate under certain part of Florida Drug & Cosmetic Act, etc. Creates 465.0158; amends 499.01,.081. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 2436 (2R) by Senator Siplin—

Road Designations/Orange County; designates portion of State Road 50 in Orange County as Martin L. King, Jr., Drive; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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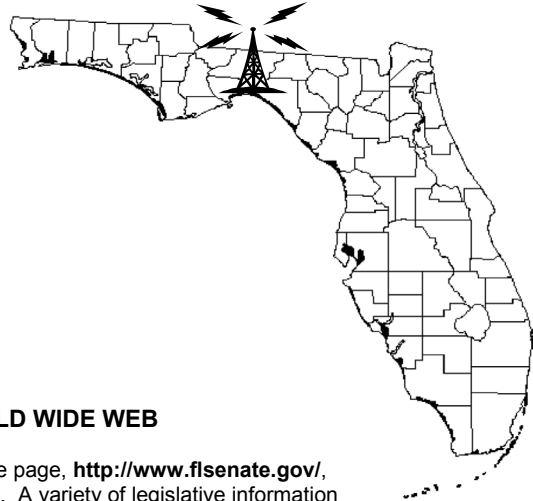
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
