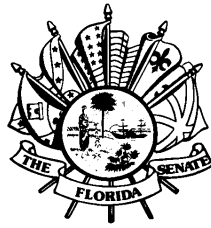

CS/SB 660 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Carlton—

Assets Held in Benefit Plans; exempts certain tax-exempt funds or accounts from legal process in favor of creditors; exempts from legal process in favor of creditors or other claimants assets held in qualified tuition programs, in certain health savings accounts & medical savings accounts, in Coverdell education savings accounts, or in hurricane savings accounts, etc. Amends Ch. 710, 222.21, .22, 733.808, 744.301. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 13, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1322 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Constantine)—

Public Service Commission; creates Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight as standing joint committee of Legislature; specifies that Governor has no planning or budgetary authority re commission; requires that commission refer certain matters affecting substantial interest of utility to Administrative Hearings Div. so that administrative judge may be assigned to conduct hearing & enter recommended order, etc. Amends Ch. 350, 120.80. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

HB 155 (3R) by Representative Machek and others—

Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; provides legislative findings re implementation & funding of Lake Okeechobee Watershed Phosphorus Control Program & Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; revises definition; provides that DOACS, DEP, & South Fla. Water Management District be jointly responsible for implementing Lake Okeechobee Protection Plan; requires that annual funding priorities be jointly established; provides criteria for funding priorities, etc. Amends 373.4595. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Substituted for CS/SB 502 (SUB) (Alexander) and read the second time on April 13, 2005

HB 349 (3R) by Representative Brummer and others—

Auditor Selection Procedures; revises auditor selection procedures that local governmental entities, district school boards, charter schools, & charter technical career centers must use in selecting auditors to conduct certain required financial audits; revises provisions re membership, purposes, & duties of audit committees required to be established to aid in such selection; provides for requests for proposals; provides review & ranking requirements, etc. Amends 218.391. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Substituted for CS/SB 1072 (SUB) (Atwater) and read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 1194 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Bennett—

Homestead Assessments; provides exception to requirements to assess certain homestead property at just value under certain circumstances; provides limitations. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 938 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Adverse Medical Incidents; cites act as "Patients' Right-to-Know About Adverse Medical Incidents Act"; specifies patients' right of access to records re said incident; prohibits disclosure of identity of certain patients; provides for maintaining privacy restrictions imposed by federal law; provides restrictions upon use of records; provides for ID & production of records; provides for fees charged for copies of records, etc. Creates 381.028. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 1144 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Argenziano—

Public Records & Meetings; clarifies general state policy on public records; makes editorial & conforming changes; transfers exemptions from public records requirements under that section to indicated sections of Florida Statutes; transfers exemptions provided for social security numbers to specified provision; revises standards & guidelines for review & repeal of exemptions from public records & public meetings requirements pursuant to OGSR Act, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 646 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell—

Juvenile Offenders; revises sentencing provisions for juvenile offenders who violate terms of their probation; revises references to obsolete offices within DOC re youthful offenders. Amends 958.045,.11. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

SB 1172 (3R) by Senator Jones—

Birth-Related Neurological Injury; authorizes administrative law judge to determine if notice requirements have been satisfied when claim is made under Fla. Birth-Related Neurological Injury Compensation Plan; provides legislative intent re provision clarifying jurisdiction of administrative law judge; authorizes State Board of Administration to invest funds held on behalf of said plan. Amends 766.309,.315. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 940 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Repeated Medical Malpractice; requires DOH to verify information submitted by person who applies for initial licensure, or renewal of licensure as physician; prescribes acts that constitute repeated medical malpractice; provides for review of acts & determination by Board of Medicine & Osteopathic Medicine Board; extends 90-day requirement for granting or denying complete allopathic or osteopathic licensure application to 180 days, etc. Amends Chs. 456, 458, 459. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 612 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Hill and others—

Veterans' Day/Schools; requires school districts to observe Veterans' Day; prohibits holding classes on that day; provides exception; requires date of Veterans' Day observance to correspond with federal holiday. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 1662 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Fasano and others—

Insurance; revises exception from prohibition against representing or aiding unauthorized insurers; provides for immediate cease-and-desist orders for violations of prohibition; authorizes investigations of activities that may constitute violations of prohibition; provides exception from penalty provisions for person who cooperates with office to administer Unauthorized Insurers Process Law, etc. Amends 626.901,.902,.908. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 13, 2005

CS/SB 1508 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Garcia and others—

Life Insurance & Annuity Contracts; provides that certificate of authority is not required of insurers domiciled outside U.S. for certain life insurance policies or annuity contracts covering only persons who are not residents of U.S. & are not nonresidents illegally residing in U.S.; provides criteria, requirements, & limitations; provides for Insurance Regulation Office to determine when insurer is no longer eligible for exemption, etc. Amends 624.402. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

HB 77 (3R) by Representative Littlefield and others—

Waste-to-energy Facilities/Permit; revises permit or certification requirement for waste-to-energy facility. Amends 403.7061. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Substituted for CS/SB 494 (SUB) (Bennett), read the second time and amended on April 13, 2005

HB 281 (3R) by Representative Sansom and others—

School Districts/Paperwork Reduction; requires establishment of Paper Reduction Task Force & provides membership; requires recommendations to minimize paperwork burden placed on school districts & school district personnel; requires report to Legislature; provides for abolishment of task force. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for SB 784 (SUB) (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 13, 2005

SB 1980 (3R) by Senator Sebesta—

Florida Commission on Tourism; designates member from restaurant industry to said commission; revises financial-disclosure requirements for commission members to conform with those of other statewide boards & commissions exercising governing authority; repeals provisions re statewide advisory committee of Florida Commission on Tourism. Amends 288.1223. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

SB 1796 (3R) by Senator Atwater—

Property Tax Administration; provides that if DOR finds that more than 10 percent of sales qualified or disqualified by county do not fall within applicable criteria, dept. shall issue postaudit notification of defects instead of review notice; revises requirements placed on dept. in its review of assessment rolls. Amends 195.0995,.096. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

SB 1460 (3R) by Senator Bennett and others—

Motor Vehicle Registration; requires that registration application form contain provision permitting voluntary contribution to be distributed to Southeastern Guide Dogs, Inc.; provides for use of funds; exempts such funds from general revenue service charge. Amends 320.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 13, 2005

HJR 1177 (3R) by Representative Troutman and others—

Term Limits/Constitutional Officers; constitutional amendment to increase, from 8 to 12, number of consecutive years state legislator may serve in that office before being denied right to have his or her name appear on ballot for re-election to that office; applies to those officers whose consecutive years in office begin in November 2006 or thereafter, etc. Amends s. 4, Art. VI; creates s. 26, Art. XII.

Substituted for CS/SJR's 1210 & 1362 (SUB) (Sebesta) and read the second time on April 13, 2005

CS/CS/SB 492 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Judiciary, Senator Bennett and others—

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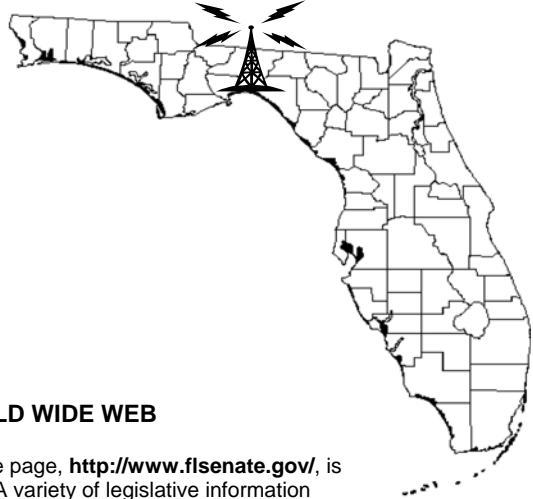
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
