BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 718 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Sebesta—

Transportation Department; authorizes dept. to adopt rules governing leasing of property for joint public-private development; grants local governments authority to issue permits allowing limited temporary use of state transportation right-of-way; establishes maximum limit on state-funded infrastructure bank loans to State Transportation TF; revises requirements for projects intended to mitigate adverse effects of transportation projects; etc. Amends Chs. 337, 339, 373. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 20, 2005

HB 1659 (3R) by Representative Kottkamp and others—

Termination of Minor's Pregnancy; provides that actual notice shall be given by physician who will perform termination of pregnancy procedure; specifies information required to be included in notices; provides circumstances in which prior notice is not required; provides that violation of notice requirements by physicians shall be considered medical malpractice; requires Supreme Court to ensure certain proceedings are conducted expeditiously & lawfully, etc. Amends 390.01115. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

CS/CS/SB 202 (3R) by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator Saunders and others—

Community Contribution Tax Credit; requires Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office to reserve portions of certain annual tax credits for donations made to eligible sponsors for projects that provide homeownership opportunities for certain households; increases amount of available annual community contribution tax credits; limits application of certain retaliatory tax provisions under certain circumstances, etc. Amends 212.08, 220.03, .183, 624.5105. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

SB 550 (3R) by Senator Clary and others—

Property Tax Exemption/Disabled Vets; defines term "ex-service member" for purposes of Exemption laws; revises qualifications for exemption; entitles surviving spouse of disabled ex-service member to exemption from property taxation for value of certain property under certain circumstances. Amends 196.012,.24 Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

HB 775 (3R) by the Committee on Future of Florida's Families (HFC), Representative Galvano and others—

Child Support Enforcement; provides civil penalties for employers, unions, & plan administrators not in compliance with requirements of national medical support notice; provides for sharing of information between consumer reporting agencies & DOR re amount of current support owed; provides for amendment of allocation of support recovery within settlement agreement; provides procedure for redirecting payments to person with whom child resides, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1262 (SUB)** (Campbell) and read the second time on April 27, 2005*

CS/SB 1884 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Child Support; provides for civil penalty, costs, & attorney's fees against employer, union, or plan administrator for failing to enroll child in health care coverage; requires repayment of support delinquency through additional income deduction; provides for suspension of driver's license to enforce compliance with order to appear for genetic testing; requires DOH to amend child's birth certificate when paternity is established by DOR, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/CS/SB 1784 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Regulated Industries, Senator Clary and others—

Professional Services Acquisition; revises certain definitions; defines term "negotiate"; provides additional criteria for processing bids to purchase professional services which exceed certain threshold amounts; revises limitation on use of state aircraft. Amends 287.055,.17. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/CS/SB 1026 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity and the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services (King)—

Future of Space in Florida; creates Commission on Future of Space in Florida; provides for membership & organization; provides for administrative & staff assistance from Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Off.; requires commission to identify, examine, & review certain information re aerospace & aerospace industry; directs certain agencies & requests other agencies to render assistance & cooperation; amends definition, etc. Amends 331.405. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

HB 577 (3R) by Representative Needelman and others—

Interstate Compact for Juveniles; revises provisions of former Interstate Compact on Juveniles; provides for Interstate Commission for Juveniles; provides for oversight, enforcement, & dispute resolution by Interstate Commission; provides for activities of said commission to be financed by annual assessment from each compacting state; requires member states to create State Council for Interstate Juvenile Supervision; provides for future legislative review & repeal, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005 except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 274 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time on April 27, 2005*

CS/CS/SB 620 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Communications and Public Utilities, Senator Bennett and others—

Wireless Emergency Telephone System; removes annual audit of Wireless Emergency Telephone System Fund from duties of Auditor General; revises provisions for certain nonemergency telephone number pilot projects; specifies that state & local governments are not customers under provisions for wireless E911 monthly fee; authorizes local governments to continue requesting information until application deficiencies are cured, etc. Amends 11.45, 364.02, 365.171,.172,.173, 337.401. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

SB 1360 (3R) by Senator Rich and others—

Adult Protective Services; defines "neglect" to include actions of vulnerable adult against himself or herself; provides that CFS Dept. may petition court for order authorizing provision of protective services for said adult in need of services. Amends 415.102,.1051. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB 874 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Sale/Distribution/Prescription Drugs; redefines term "pedigree paper"; provides exemption from wholesale distribution for transfer of said drugs due to change in ownership of pharmacy; prohibits AHCA from reviewing or using certain violations re recordkeeping for prescription drugs to deny or withhold Medicaid payments to pharmacies or to audit records of such pharmacies, etc. Amends 499.003,.012,.0121. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB's 1872, SB 2378 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Care, Senators Saunders, Fasano and others—

Biomedical Research; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1872 & 2378) provides legislative intent; redistributes certain funds collected from taxes on alcoholic beverages; revises purpose of Fla. Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease; requires Legislature to annually appropriate funds to James & Esther King Biomedical Research Program & to support research to Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center & Research Institute, etc. Amends 561.121, 381.855,.921, 215.5602, 1004.445. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

HB 1699 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Kottkamp—

Domestic Violence Cases/OSGR; (Open Government Sunset Review Act); amends provision which provides public records exemption for information provided to sheriff or state attorney in specified domestic violence cases in which person seeks shelter from act or possible act of domestic violence & takes with him or her any child 17 years of age or younger; extends repeal date scheduled under OGSR Act; narrows exemption. Amends 787.03. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 1389 (3R) by Representative Domino—

Water Control Districts; revises powers of board of supervisors of a water control district to execute water control plans; revises provisions for water control plan development & amendment; clarifies authority of certain districts as exclusive providers of certain services & facilities; revises water control plan adoption procedures; revises provisions for assessment liens; provides for revision of engineer's report pursuant to assessment readjustment. Amends Ch.298. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **SB 2460 (SUB)** (Atwater), read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005*

CS/CS/SB 926 (3R) by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Constantine—

Interlocal Svc. Boundary Agreement; creates Interlocal Service Boundary Agreement Act; provides legislative intent re annexation & coordination of services by local governments; provides for creation of said agreements by county & one or more municipalities or independent special districts; provides for place of filing interlocal agreement in certain circumstances, etc. Creates 171.20-.212, 171.094; amends 163.01, 164.1058, 171.042,.044,.081. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1650 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator King and others—

Workforce Innovation; revises organization, powers, & duties of Agency for Workforce Innovation; revises certain provisions re funding under federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998; requires dispute-resolution process under certain circumstances; revises organizational requirements for regional workforce boards; provides for director of agency to serve on Commission for Transportation Disadvantaged, etc. Amends 20.50, 427.012, Chs. 445, 446. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 514 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Wilson and others—

Civil Rights Restoration/Prisoners; requires that administrator of county detention facility provide application form for restoration of civil rights to prisoner who has been convicted of felony & is serving sentence in that facility; authorizes use of volunteers to assist prisoner in completing application; provides that this section does not apply to prisoners who are transferred to DOC. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1308 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Regulated Industries (Jones)—

Florida Clean Indoor Air Act; defines term "person" & "proprietor or other person in charge of enclosed indoor workplace" for purposes of act; eliminates certain exceptions to prohibition against smoking in enclosed indoor workplace; prohibits proprietor or person in charge of enclosed indoor workplace from permitting smoking in that workplace; provides penalty for vendor who knowingly makes false statement on annual compliance affidavit, etc. Amends Ch. 386, 561.695. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

HB 1695 (3R) by the Committee on PreK-12 (EDC), Representative Arza and others—

Voluntary Pre-K Education Program; creates exemption from public records requirements for individual records of children enrolled in Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program; provides for retroactive application; provides for exceptions to exemption; provides for future review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Creates 1002.72. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 2220 (SUB)** (King) and read the second time on April 27, 2005*

CS/CS/CS/SB 1366 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Government Efficiency Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Senator Constantine and others—

Storm Infrastructure Recovery; authorizes electric utilities to petition Fla. PSC for certain financing orders for certain storm-recovery purposes; provides powers & duties of commission in issuing such orders; authorizes electric utilities to create storm-recovery property; provides for pledge of said property to secure storm-recovery bonds; provides exceptions to commission jurisdiction to issue financing orders, etc. Creates 366.8260; amends 679.1091. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 484 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Health Care/Nursing; revises purpose of Home Health Agencies provisions to include licensure of nurse registries; revises requirements for license application by home health agency; revises ownership of patient records generated by said agency; provides for continued confidentiality of patient information in compliance with federal law; revises requirements governing nurse registries; increases license fee, etc. Amends Ch. 400. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 2364 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Fasano—

Elderly Affairs; deletes requirement for AHCA to develop plan to integrate plan for frail elderly persons into diversion pilot program; deletes agency's requirement to integrate two separate Medicaid waiver programs into one waiver program; revises eligibility requirements re financial solvency for entities that provide services under long-term care community diversion pilot projects, etc. Amends 430.205, .7031, .705, .707. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

*Similar to **CS/HB 1525 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Care and Health and Human Services Appropriations*

SB 288 (3R) by the Committee on Domestic Security (Diaz de la Portilla)—

Seaport Security Plan/Pub. Rec./OGSR; (OPEN GOVERNMENT SUNSET REVIEW) amends provision re exemption from public records requirements for seaport security plans; saves exemption from repeal under OGSR Act; deletes provisions that provide for repeal of exemption. Amends 311.13. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

HB 977 (3R) by Representative Adams and others—

Airport Regulation/Security Plans; prohibits DOT from renewing or reissuing licenses to certain general aviation airports that fail to develop security plan; requires that plans be consistent with certain published guidelines; requires certain information in plans to be submitted to FDLE; requires periodic update of plans. Amends 330.30. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1808 (SUB)** (Campbell), read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005*

HB 1729 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Kottkamp—

Fla. College Savings Program/OGSR; (OPEN GOVERNMENT SUNSET REVIEW) revises public-records exemption for Fla. College Savings Program; narrows exemption; deletes provisions that provide for repeal of exemption under Open Government Sunset Review Act. Amends 1009.981. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 896 (SUB)** (Lynn) and read the second time on April 27, 2005*

CS/SB 1154 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services and Senator Dockery—

Enterprise Florida, Inc.; deletes requirement that Enterprise Florida, Inc., assist in expansion of solar energy industry & solar technology; repeals provision re International Trade Data Resource & Research Center; specifies moneys & contributions that may be considered as private-sector support to Enterprise Florida, Inc.; requires that annual report include study; revises power of board to make & enter into contracts, etc. Amends Ch. 288. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 1748 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture (Smith)—

Agricultural Water Conservation; requires each water management district to review rule criteria for environmental resource permits, existing permit exemptions, & alternatives to standard permitting programs, & recommend regulatory alternatives that will encourage agricultural water conservation; requires report by DOACS & DEP to appropriate legislative committees; conforms cross reference, etc. Amends 373.2234, .236, .406. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

HB 1483 (3R) by the Committee on Economic Development, Trade & Banking (CC), Representative Bilirakis and others—

Tax Refund Prog./Defense Contractors; specifies order of payment of claims for certain tax refunds for qualified defense contractors & target industry businesses; provides duties of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Off. in paying certain tax refunds from appropriations; revises certain reporting requirements of Enterprise Florida, Inc.; includes state communications services taxes under qualified defense contractor tax refund program provisions, etc. Amends 288.095, .1045, .106. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 2216 (SUB)** (Saunders) and read the second time on April 27, 2005*

CS/SB 124 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Senator Bennett and others—

Foster Children/Vehicle Insurance; creates pilot program for purpose of reimbursing foster parents, residential facilities, or foster children who live independently for portion of increased costs of motor vehicle insurance for foster child who has driver's license; directs CFS Dept. to establish pilot program in Sarasota, Desoto, Manatee, Pinellas, & Pasco Counties; requires that foster children be encouraged to pay remaining portion of increase in costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

HB 1923 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Kottkamp—

OGSR Telecommunications/Cable/Info.; (OPEN GOVERNMENT SUNSET REVIEW) revises public records exemption for proprietary confidential business information obtained from telecommunications company or franchised cable company for specified purposes under Communications Services Tax Simplification Law; removes October 2, 2005, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act; removes superfluous language; makes editorial changes. Amends 202.195. Effective Date: 09/30/2005.

Substituted for CS/SB 680 (SUB) (Constantine) and read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 2278 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Baker and others—

Private Security Officer/Firearms; revises types of firearms that security officer is authorized to carry. Amends 493.6115. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

HB 1673 (3R) by Representative Kottkamp and others—

Second Primary Election; eliminates said election; repeals provision re holding of special elections in conjunction with said election, to conform; amends provisions re restrictions on changing party affiliation between primary elections, to conform; amends provisions re qualifying for nomination or election to office, to conform; adjusts date to designate Lt. Gov. running mate, to conform, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2006.

Substituted for CS/SB's 1268 & 1956 (SUB) (Clary) and read the second time on April 27, 2005

SB 1502 (3R) by Senator Fasano—

Children's Hearing Help Fund; allows driver's license applicants to make \$1 contribution to Children's Hearing Help Fund. Amends 322.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB 518 (3R) by the Committees on Education, Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Health Professionals/Speech; revises requirements for DOH in issuing provisional license to practice speech-language pathology or audiology; authorizes Board of Speech-Language Pathology & Audiology to waive certain requirements for applicants who received professional education in another country under certain circumstances; revises requirements for person to be certified as audiology assistant, etc. Amends 468.1155,.1165,.1185,.1215. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 27, 2005

CS/SB 2412 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Garcia—

Viatical Settlements; specifies nonapplication of certain exemptions to viatical settlement investments; authorizes Financial Services Commission to adopt rules establishing requirements & standards for disclosures & records re viatical settlement investments; requires commission to establish by rule rules of conduct & prohibited business practices for investment advisers & associated persons, etc. Amends Ch. 517, 626, 624.501. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2005

CS/CS/SB 662 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Community Affairs and Senator Clary—

CS/SB 2344 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Haridopolos—

Funeral, Cemetery, & Consumer Svcs.; creates public-meetings exemption for Board of Funeral, Cemetery, & Consumer Services for those portions of meetings conducted for exclusive purpose of developing or reviewing licensure examination questions & answers; creates public-meetings exemption for probable cause panel meetings of board; maintains public records exemptions under certain circumstances; creates public records exemption for trade secrets, etc. Creates 497.172. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

CS/CS/CS/SB 2346 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Banking and Insurance, Regulated Industries and Senator Haridopolos—

Funeral & Cemetery Industry Reg.; provides for lighting equipment on certain non-law enforcement vehicles in funeral procession; revises licensure application procedures to provide for persons other than natural persons; authorizes licensing authority to adopt certain rules for centralized embalming facility; authorizes anatomical board of this state to provide for final disposition of human remains delivered to board as board determines to be adequate & proper, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Pharmacy Technicians; authorizes pharmacy technicians to initiate or receive requests for original prescriptions when dispensing for nonhuman use; prohibits licensed pharmacist from supervising more than certain number of pharmacy technicians in dispensing prescriptions for nonhuman use; provides exception to certain requirements for dispensing medicinal drugs for nonhuman use via facsimile. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

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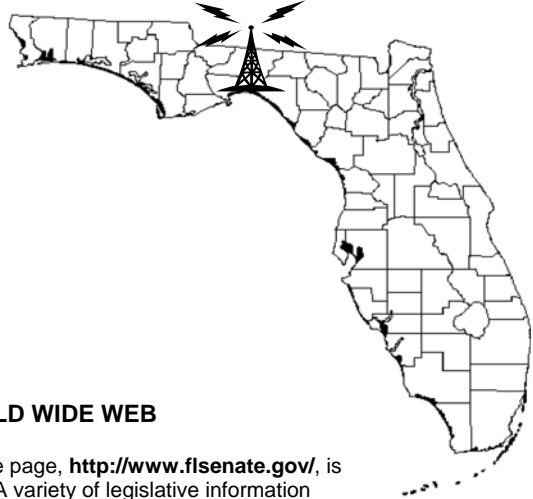
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
