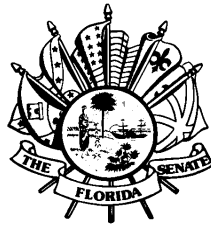

CS/SB 2646 (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Sebasta—

Lobbying; amends provision re requirements that legislative lobbyists register & report as required by legislative rule; requires lobbying activity reports to include name & address of each person to whom lobbying expenditure was made, amount, date, & purpose of expenditure, & name & title of person for whom expenditure was made; requires that lobbying-activity reports be electronically filed, etc. Amends Chs. 11, 112. Effective Date: 01/01/2006 except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 2644 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Sebasta—

Legislative Info. Services/Pub. Rec.; creates exemption from public-records requirements for user identification & passwords held by Legislative Information Services Division pursuant to specified provision; creates exemption from public-records requirements for user IDs & passwords held by Ethics Comm. pursuant to specified provision; provides for future legislative review & repeal under OGSR Act; provides findings of public necessity. Amends 11.0431, 112.3215; creates 112.32156. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

SB 96 (3R) by Senator Margolis and others—

Protection & Care for Elders; reclassifies offense of aggravated abuse of elderly person or disabled adult from second-degree felony to first-degree felony; creates provision re training on identifying & investigating elder abuse for certified law enforcement officers; provides that officer's certification becomes inactive in certain circumstances re failure to complete training, etc. Amends 825.102, 921.0022; creates 943.17296. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 690 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Lynn—

Immunizations/Mercury Contents; prohibits vaccinating woman who is knowingly pregnant or child who is younger than specified age with vaccine that contains any mercury or injecting such woman or child with product that contains more than specified amount of mercury; provides for State Health Officer to authorize use of vaccines that contain greater amount of mercury than is otherwise allowed if Health Secretary declares public health emergency & makes certain findings, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SJR 2144 (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Atwater—

State Budget Planning & Spending; constitutional amendment to limit amount of nonrecurring general revenue which may be appropriated for recurring purposes in any fiscal year to 3 percent of total general revenue funds estimated to be available, unless otherwise approved by three-fifths vote of Legislature; to establish Joint Legislative Budget Commission, which shall issue long-range financial outlooks, etc. Amends s. 19, Art. III.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 2146 (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Atwater—

State Planning & Budgeting; revises membership of Legislative Budget Commission; provides for appointment of presiding officers; creates Government Efficiency Task Force for purpose of recommending improvements to governmental operations & reducing costs; requires that task force meet at 4-year intervals beginning on specified date; requires legislative appropriations committees to prescribe format of budget expenditure reports, etc. Amends Chs. 11, 216, 29.0095, 110.1245. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 748 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Miller and others—

Fire Hydrants; requires owners of fire hydrants to test hydrants in accordance with national standards; requires nonfunctioning privately owned hydrants to be reported & repaired; provides fines for noncompliance. Amends 633.065. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1146 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Argenziano and others—

Center for Efficient Government; authorizes DMS to establish Center for Efficient Government; prescribes duties of state agency before service may be outsourced; prohibits agency from privatizing service without specific legislative authorization; prescribes contract requirements for contract that meets or exceeds specified threshold amount; provides restrictions on contractor involvement in state procurement, etc. Creates 215.4211; repeals 14.203. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

CS/CS/CS/SB 1476 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Children and Families, Senator Campbell and others—

CFS Dept./Contracts/Service Provider; provides legislative intent re establishing structure by which DCFS shall monitor & manage contracts with external service providers; requires dept. to competitively procure certain commodities & contractual services; requires dept. to allow all public postsecondary institutions to bid on contracts intended for any said institution; requires dept. to verify that contractual terms have been satisfied before renewing contract, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1494 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Argenziano—

Information Technology Management; provides legislative intent that each state agency use governance process & structure for managing its IT operations & investments in order to ensure alignment with business needs & policy requirements of agency; renames office within DMS; revises duties of Technology Resource Center; creates Fla. Technology Council within DMS; deletes provisions assigning responsibility for information resources management to State Tech. Office, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

SB 1858 (3R) by Senator Villalobos—

Public Officers/Standards of Conduct; prohibits citizen members of Board of Governors of State University System & citizen members of board of trustees of local constituent university from representing principals before Legislature. Amends 112.313. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

SB 450 (3R) by Senator Geller—

Motor Vehicle Ins. Increase/Military; provides that certain rate increases for motor vehicle insurance for insureds on active military service, & their covered dependents, constitute unfair practices; provides penalties. Amends 626.9541. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

SB 868 (3R) by Senator Dockery—

E. R. Pipping, Jr., Memorial Act; cites act as "Ellwood Robinson 'Bob' Pipping, Jr., Memorial Act"; provides purpose; authorizes DOT to contract with not-for-profit group or organization for installation of plaques, markers, monuments, memorials, or various retired military equipment at rest stops; provides for committee to approve proposals for contracts; provides that group or organization shall be responsible for costs & provide bond to secure certain costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 1312 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services and Senator Carlton—

Recreational Vehicles; requires DOT to incorporate certain markers on logo signs for certain establishments; eliminates future termination of RV Mediation & Arbitration Program; revises requirements for program certification to ensure neutrality of dispute resolution; provides that program must complete all mediation & arbitration within 70 days after receipt of claim; provides & revises dispute resolution guidelines for consumers of said vehicles, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

SB 1352 (3R) by Senator Aronberg—

Fla. Inland Navigation District; provides responsibility & authority of Board of Commissioners of said district re that portion of Okeechobee Waterway located in Martin & Palm Beach Counties; revises list of acts authorizing & directing improvement & maintenance of Intracoastal Waterway & that portion of Okeechobee Waterway located in said counties; provides exception for maintaining navigability of Okeechobee Waterway under certain circumstances. Amends 374.984. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1114 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation, Regulated Industries and Senator King—

Restaurants/Resealed Wine Containers; authorizes restaurant patron to remove resealed wine container from restaurant for off-premise consumption; provides that resealed wine container is not open container for purposes of prohibition against possessing open container of alcohol in vehicle. Creates 564.09; amends 316.1936. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 732 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Bennett and others—

Road Rage Reduction Act; provides popular name; requires operators of motor vehicles to drive in right-hand lane on certain highways; provides penalties for violation; provides for assessment of points for violating specified provisions that require operators of motor vehicles to drive on right side of road; requires HSMV to provide educational awareness campaign; provides grace period when warnings & educational literature may be issued, etc. Amends 316.081, 322.27. Effective Date: 07/01/2005 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2005

CS/SB 1436 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Geller and others—

Automated External Defibrillators; authorizes state & local law enforcement vehicles to carry automated external defibrillator; authorizes local governments to use forfeiture funds for purchasing such defibrillators. Amends 401.2915, 932.7055. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 6, 2005

SB 2600 (SO) by the Committee on Ways and Means (Carlton)—

Appropriations; provides monies for annual period beginning July 1, 2005, & ending June 30, 2006, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2005 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later, except as otherwise provided.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

SB 2602 (SO) by the Committee on Ways and Means (Carlton)—

Appropriations Implementing Bill; provides legislative intent; provides for use of specified calculations re Fla. Education Finance Program; provides for budget of Council for Education Policy Research & Improvement to be administered by Auditor General; provides that council is otherwise independent; authorizes DCFS to transfer funds within family safety program; requires that Workforce Fla. Inc., offer incentive bonuses; provides requirements for same, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005 except as otherwise provided.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 388 (SO) by the Committee on Education Appropriations and Senator Alexander—

Student Financial Aid; authorizes deposit of funds appropriated by Legislature for student financial assistance into State Student Financial Assistance Trust Fund; eliminates requirement that funds appropriated for William L. Boyd, IV, Florida Resident Access Grant Program be deposited into such trust fund. Amends 1009.50, .51, .52, .89. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Appropriations and the Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 392 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Clary—

Water Quality Assurance Trust Fund; authorizes DEP to use certain funds for brownfield activities. Amends 376.307. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and the Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 394 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Clary—

Enforcement of Farm Labor Laws; requires that moneys to enforce farm labor laws be transferred to Professional Regulation Trust Fund from Workers' Compensation Administration Trust Fund within Financial Services Dept.; authorizes appropriation of moneys for such purpose. Amends 450.38. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and the Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 400 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Clary—

Procurement/Commodities/Contracts; requires that DMS compensate provider for on-line procurement pursuant to appropriation after satisfying ongoing costs; requires that provider report transaction data to dept.; requires that fees due to state on transactional basis or as fixed percentage of savings generated be deposited into State Treasury; requires that vendor pay interest on balance of fees remaining due & unpaid. Amends 287.057. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and the Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1232 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Lynn—

Wind-protection/Fla. Building Code; provides for removal of outdated wind-protection standards from said code; provides for update of code's wind-protection standards; provides for incorporation in Fla. Building Code of repeal of design option re internal pressure for buildings within windborne debris region; requires Fla. Bldg. Commission to make recommendations to Legislature. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Regulated Industries reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 1300 (2R) by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations and Senator Campbell—

Corp. Income Tax/Limitation/Refunds; revises provisions for determining when payment of estimated tax is deemed paid for purposes of time limitations for refund claims; provides for retroactive application. Amends 220.727. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations

SB 1980 (2R) by Senator Sebesta—

Florida Commission on Tourism; designates member from restaurant industry to said commission; revises financial-disclosure requirements for commission members to conform with those of other statewide boards & commissions exercising governing authority; repeals provisions re statewide advisory committee of Florida Commission on Tourism. Amends 288.1223. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Commerce and Consumer Services, and Ethics and Elections

CS/SB 2136 (2R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Baker—

Administration of Medication; authorizes certain staff members to administer prescription medications under supervision of registered nurse to persons with developmental disabilities at comprehensive transitional education program; directs Agency for Persons with Disabilities to adopt rules to implement specified provision. Amends 393.506. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health Care and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

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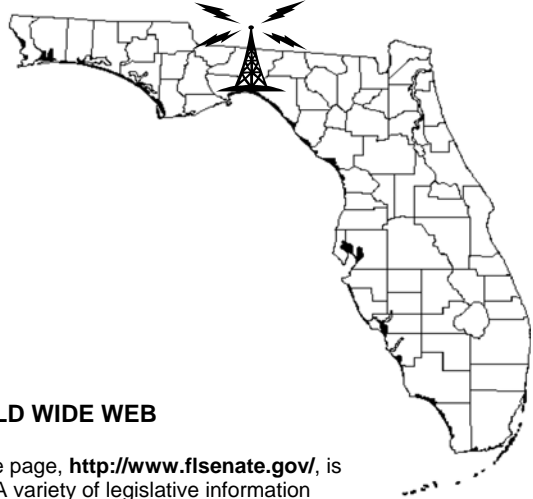
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
