### SB 1856 (SO) by Senator Villalobos-

**Commission on Ethics;** prohibits individual who qualifies as lobbyist from serving on commission; prohibits member of commission from lobbying any state or local governmental entity; provides exceptions for individuals who are members of commission on effective date of act until expiration of their current terms. Amends 112.321. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

# SB 1440 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Wise)—

**Time Limitations/Criminal Offenses;** reorganizes provisions establishing time limitations for prosecuting criminal offenses; clarifies certain provisions; amends provision re execution of sentence to conform cross-reference. Amends 775.15, 922.105. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

# CS/SB 1454 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Webster—

**Tourist Safety Act of 2005;** provides definitions; prohibits distribution, & direction of such distribution, of handbills in public lodging establishment in certain circumstances; provides penalties; provides requirements for posting sign that prohibits advertising or solicitation. Creates 509.144. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

### SB 1020 (SO) by Senator Haridopolos and others—

**Police, Fire, SAR Dogs/Police Horses;** prohibits intentionally & knowingly causing great bodily harm to or using deadly weapon upon said animals; prohibits actually & intentionally maliciously touching, striking, or causing bodily harm to said animals; prohibits maliciously harassing, teasing, interfering with, or attempting to interfere with said animals while animal is in performance of its duties; provides for restitution from violators, etc. Amends 843.19. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

## SB 470 (SO) by Senator Argenziano and others-

**Indigent Care Surtax**; allows small counties having specified population to levy indigent care surtax; provides procedures; provides uses of surtax; provides maximum tax rate. Revives/Reenacts/Amends 212.055(7). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

### SB 904 (SO) by Senator Dockery-

**Privatization of Foster Care**; provides that lead community-based provider & its subcontractors supplying foster care & related services are exempt from including in written contracts & other written documents certain statements required by law; provides exception if said provider or its subcontractors receive more than 51 percent of their total funding from state. Amends 409.1671. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 558 (SO) by Senator Rich and others-

**Cruelty to Animals;** increases certain minimum mandatory fines &periods of incarceration for certain acts of cruelty to animals; provides definition; provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to intentionally drag or fell by tail bovine animal in organized sports exhibition; provides clarification regarding techniques or practices that are not prohibited. Amends 828.12,.121. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

# CS/SB 1330 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Atwater—

**Financial Institutions/Credit Unions;** prescribes methods of serving process, notice, or demand on financial institutions; authorizes emergency action in cases of failing financial entities; revises procedures applicable to applying for authority to organize credit union; revises provisions re changes of credit union's place of business & to establishing branch locations; revises credit unions' loan powers, including power to issue debit or credit cards, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

# CS/SB 1432 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Baker—

Insurance Administrators; redefines term "administrator" & defines terms "affiliate," "control," & "GAAP"; requires additional information to accompany application for certificate of authority to act as administrator; details responsibilities of insurance company in its dealings with administrator; prescribes information that must be submitted in administrator's annual report, etc. Amends 626.88,.8805,.8817,.89; creates 626.8991. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

# CS/SB 552 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services and Senator Margolis—

**Game Promotion/Consumer Products;** provides that operator of game promotion in which total announced value of prizes offered is greater than \$5,000 need include only material terms of rules & regulations of game in all advertising copy used in connection therewith if advertising copy contains information for obtaining full rules & regulations of game. Amends 849.094. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably

# CS/SB 1130 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Crist—

Abandonment of Roads; conforms cross-reference; transfers & renumbers provision re county's authority to close & abandon roads & rights-of-way & convey county's interest to homeowners' association. Amends 316.006,.00825; transfers & renumbers 336.125. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 878 (SO) by Senator Baker-

**Delinquent Property Taxes**; reduces number of required advertisements for certain tax certificate sales; specifies minimum time period for such advertisement prior to sale; revises requirement for transmitting copy of published notice. Amends 197.402,.403. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Amends 61.14. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

## SB 784 (SO) by Senator Haridopolos-

**School Districts/Paperwork Reduction;** requires establishment of Paper Reduction Task Force & provides membership; requires recommendations to minimize paperwork burden placed on school districts & school district personnel; requires report to Legislature. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Government Efficiency Appropriations

## SB 772 (SO) by Senator Dockery-

**Inland Lakes & Canals;** exempts from permitting requirements placement of informational markers on inland lakes & associated canals by counties, municipalities, or other governmental entities; provides requirements for placement of such markers; specifies that placement of informational markers on state submerged lands does not subject such lands to specified lease requirements. Amends 327.40. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Community Affairs

#### SB 1798 (SO) by Senator Atwater-

**Corporate Income Tax/2005 IRS Code**; provides for adoption of 2005 version of Internal Revenue Code; provides for retroactive operation. Amends 220.03. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

### SB 2042 (SO) by Senator Fasano-

**Welfare Transition TF/Military**; creates Welfare Transition Trust Fund within Military Affairs Dept.; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Amends 250.175. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

**Herbert F. Morgan Building;** designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

#### SB 116 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others-

**Culpable Negligence/Vehicles/DUI;** provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to commit culpable negligence by driving vehicle under influence of alcohol or drugs while accompanied in vehicle by person younger than specified age. Amends 784.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/SB 118 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Saunders—

**Massage Therapy Regulation;** exempts certain settings where massage therapy is rendered from licensure & inspection requirements for massage establishments. Amends 480.034. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

## CS/SB 122 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Saunders and others—

**Homestead Exemption/Fraudulent Act;** provides value-based sliding scale of criminal penalties applicable to claimant who knowingly & willfully gives false information for purpose of claiming homestead exemption if funds for homestead were obtained by commission of fraudulent act. Amends 196.131. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

## CS/SB 232 (2R) by the Committee on Domestic Security and Senator Constantine—

**Emergency Management;** provides that it is policy of Legislature to encourage counties & municipalities to explore use of emerging technologies for purpose of disseminating information to public before, during, & after emergency or natural disaster; authorizes county or municipality to establish volunteer disaster assistance recovery program, etc. Amends 252.32,.38. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Domestic Security and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 268 (2R) by Senator Posey-

**Elections/Early Voting;** changes day on which early voting ends. Amends 101.657. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

#### SB 312 (2R) by Senator Fasano-

**Prisoners/Sale of Literary Accounts;** defines terms concerning sale of literary accounts & memorabilia by & on behalf of convicted felon; provides for lien in favor of state on proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts, materials, & memorabilia payable to or accruing to convicted felon, representative of convicted felon, or profiteer of felony; provides for distribution of proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts or memorabilia, etc. Amends 944.512, 960.291. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

#### SB 450 (2R) by Senator Geller-

Motor Vehicle Ins. Increase/Military; provides that certain rate increases for motor vehicle insurance for insureds on active military service constitute unfair practices; provides penalties. Amends 626.9541. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs

## CS/SB 506 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Hill—

**Voting;** requires that mail ballot that otherwise satisfies requirements of law for mail ballots be counted even if elector dies after mailing ballot but before election day if certain conditions are met; provides that electors who die on or before election day & have cast absentee ballot shall remain on voter registration books until election is certified, etc. Amends 101.6103..657..68. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

## CS/SB 510 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Fasano and others—

**Temporary Custody of Child;** defines term "extended family member"; authorizes extended family member to bring proceeding in court to determine temporary custody of child; specifies information that must be included in petition for temporary custody by extended family member or putative father; provides that either or both of child's parents may petition court to modify order granting temporary custody under certain circumstances, etc. Amends 751.011,.02,.03,.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Children and Families, reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 554 (2R) by Senator Haridopolos and others-

**Property Taxes**; authorizes counties to cap annual growth in ad valorem tax revenues by charter; provides requirements & limitations; provides exception; prohibits ad valorem tax levies by counties in excess of amounts specified in county charter; prohibits ad valorem tax levies by counties through municipal service taxing units in excess of amounts specified in ordinance establishing unit. Amends 200.071. Effective Date: 01/01/2006.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably, with three amendments, by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations

#### SB 574 (2R) by Senator Haridopolos and others-

**Official Fruit of Florida;** designates orange as official fruit of State of Florida. Creates 15.0315. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Agriculture and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

## CS/SB 660 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Carlton—

Assets Held in Benefit Plans; exempts certain tax-exempt funds or accounts from legal process in favor of creditors; exempts from legal process in favor of creditors or other claimants assets held in qualified tuition programs, in certain health savings accounts & medical savings accounts, in Coverdell education savings accounts, or in hurricane savings accounts, etc. Amends Ch. 710, 222.21,.22, 733.808, 744.301. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

## CS/SB 690 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Lynn—

Immunizations/Mercury Contents; prohibits vaccinating woman who is knowingly pregnant or child who is younger than specified age with vaccine that contains any mercury or injecting such woman or child with product that contains more than specified amount of mercury; provides for State Health Officer to authorize use of vaccines that contain greater amount of mercury than is otherwise allowed if Health Secretary declares public health emergency & makes certain findings, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

## CS/SB 832 (2R) by the Committee on Agriculture, Senator Smith and others—

**Obsolete Agricultural Equipment;** provides for obsolete agricultural equipment to be assessed at its value as salvage; defines term "agricultural equipment"; provides procedure for taxpayer to claim right of assessment under this section; authorizes property appraiser to require information establishing taxpayer's right to classification. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

#### CS/SB 1464 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Senator Constantine—

**Renewable Energy;** authorizes Public Service Commission to approve experimental or transitional rates to encourage use of renewable energy. Amends 366.075. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation

## CS/CS/SB 518 (2R) by the Committees on Education, Health Care and Senator Peaden—

Health Professionals/Speech; revises requirements for DOH in issuing provisional license to practice speech-language pathology or audiology; authorizes Board of Speech-Language Pathology & Audiology to waive certain requirements for applicants who received professional education in another country under certain circumstances; revises requirements for person to be certified as audiology assistant, etc. Amends 468.1155,.1165,.1185,.1215. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

#### SB 642 (2R) by Senator Rich and others-

**Mobility-impaired Pedestrians/Dogs;** requires vehicle operators to stop & yield to mobility-impaired pedestrians who are assisted by guide dogs or other service animals; provides penalty. Amends 316.1303. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation and Community Affairs

#### SB 868 (2R) by Senator Dockery-

E. R. Pipping, Jr., Memorial Act; cites act as "Ellwood Robinson 'Bob' Pipping, Jr., Memorial Act"; provides purpose; authorizes DOT to contract with group or organization for installation & maintenance of memorials at rest stops; provides for committee to approve proposals for contracts; provides for membership & terms of members of committee; requires approval by committee for such contracts; requires that group or organization be responsible for costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation and Community Affairs

#### SB 1352 (2R) by Senator Aronberg-

Fla. Inland Navigation District; provides responsibility & authority of Board of Commissioners of said district re that portion of Okeechobee Waterway located in Martin & Palm Beach Counties; revises list of acts authorizing & directing improvement &maintenance of Intracoastal Waterway & that portion of Okeechobee Waterway located in said counties; provides exception for maintaining navigability of Okeechobee Waterway under certain circumstances. Amends 374.984. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Community Affairs

#### SB 1858 (2R) by Senator Villalobos-

**Public Officers/Standards of Conduct;** prohibits members of Board of Governors of State University System & members of board of trustees of local constituent university from representing principals before Legislature. Amends 112.313. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Ethics and Elections, and Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

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
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
