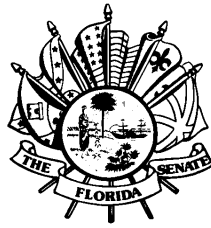

BILLS ON THIRD READING

SB 356 (3R) by Senator Lynn—

Substance Abuse Treatment; authorizes DCFS to expand certain demonstration models; includes intensive inpatient treatment within service components provided by licensed service provider; reenacts specified provision re treatment providers, to incorporate amendment to certain provision, in references thereto; amends provisions re treatment services & drug-free workplace program to conform cross-references, etc. Amends Chs. 394, 397, 212, 440; reenacts 397.405(8), 397.407(1). Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2005

SB 538 (3R) by Senator Smith and others—

Victim-impact Evidence; clarifies that prosecution may introduce & argue victim-impact evidence to jury. Amends 921.141. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

SB 1856 (3R) by Senator Villalobos—

Commission on Ethics; prohibits individual who qualifies as lobbyist from serving on commission; prohibits member of commission from lobbying any state or local governmental entity; provides exceptions for individuals who are members of commission on effective date of act until expiration of their current terms. Amends 112.321. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

SB 1440 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Wise)—

Time Limitations/Criminal Offenses; reorganizes provisions establishing time limitations for prosecuting criminal offenses; clarifies certain provisions; amends provision re execution of sentence to conform cross-reference. Amends 775.15, 922.105. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 1454 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Webster—

Tourist Safety Act of 2005; provides definitions; prohibits distribution, & direction of such distribution, of handbills in public lodging establishment in certain circumstances; provides penalties; provides requirements for posting sign that prohibits advertising or solicitation. Creates 509.144. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

SB 1020 (3R) by Senator Haridopolos and others—

Police, Fire, SAR Dogs/Police Horses; prohibits intentionally & knowingly, without justification, causing great bodily harm to or using deadly weapon upon said animals; prohibits actually & intentionally maliciously touching, striking, or causing bodily harm to said animals; prohibits maliciously harassing, teasing, interfering with, or attempting to interfere with said animals while animal is in performance of its duties; provides for restitution from violators, etc. Amends 843.19. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2005

SB 470 (3R) by Senator Argenziano and others—

Indigent Care Surtax; allows small counties having specified population to levy indigent care surtax; provides procedures; provides uses of surtax; provides maximum tax rate. Revives/Reenacts/Amends 212.055(7). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

SB 904 (3R) by Senator Dockery—

Privatization of Foster Care; provides that lead community-based provider & its subcontractors supplying foster care & related services are exempt from including in written contracts & other written documents certain statements required by law; provides exception if said provider or its subcontractors receive more than 35 percent of their total funding from state. Amends 409.1671. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2005

SB 558 (3R) by Senator Rich and others—

Cruelty to Animals; increases certain minimum mandatory fines & periods of incarceration for certain acts of cruelty to animals; provides definition; provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to intentionally drag or fell by tail bovine animal in organized sports exhibition; provides clarification regarding techniques or practices that are not prohibited. Amends 828.12, .121. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 1330 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Atwater—

Financial Institutions/Credit Unions; prescribes methods of serving process, notice, or demand on financial institutions; authorizes emergency action in cases of failing financial entities; revises procedures applicable to applying for authority to organize credit union; revises provisions re changes of credit union's place of business & to establishing branch locations; revises credit unions' loan powers, including power to issue debit or credit cards, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 1432 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Baker—

Insurance Administrators; redefines term "administrator" & defines terms "affiliate," "control," & "GAAP"; requires additional information to accompany application for certificate of authority to act as administrator; details responsibilities of insurance company in its dealings with administrator; prescribes information that must be submitted in administrator's annual report, etc. Amends 626.88, .8805, .8817, .89; creates 626.8991. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 552 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services and Senator Margolis—

Game Promotion/Consumer Products; provides that operator of game promotion in which total announced value of prizes offered is greater than \$5,000 need include only material terms of rules & regulations of game in all advertising copy used in connection therewith if advertising copy contains information for obtaining full rules & regulations of game. Amends 849.094. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 1130 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Crist—

Abandonment of Roads; conforms cross-reference; transfers & renumbers provision re county's authority to close & abandon roads & rights-of-way & convey county's interest to homeowners' association. Amends 316.006, .00825; transfers & renumbers 336.125. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 30, 2005

SB 878 (3R) by Senator Baker—

Delinquent Property Taxes; reduces number of required advertisements for certain tax certificate sales; specifies minimum time period for such advertisement prior to sale; revises requirement for transmitting copy of published notice. Amends 197.402, .403. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2005

CS/SB 152 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Siplin—

Alimony; authorizes court to modify payment of alimony if there is proof by preponderance of evidence that recipient former spouse is in de facto marriage with person of opposite sex outside of legal bond of matrimony; prescribes factors to be considered by court; provides for application. Amends 61.14. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

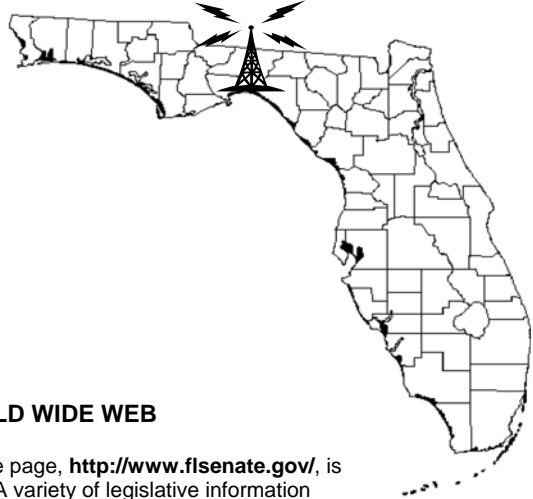
