# SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

#### FIRST PUBLICATION ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 62 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Campbell and others—

Seniors & Disabled Adults/Services; authorizes each county to create independent special district to provide funding for services for seniors & adults with developmental disabilities; clarifies that county may provide said services or create special district to provide such services by general or special law; authorizes county to create dependent special district to provide services; prohibits councils or districts from requiring matching funds from certain service providers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments

### CS/SB 64 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

**Guardianship**; authorizes guardian of property of incapacitated person to contest validity of trust before it becomes irrevocable; revises provisions re court monitors; requires orders of appointment & monitors' reports to be served upon certain persons; authorizes court to enter any order necessary to protect ward or ward's estate; authorizes court to appoint court monitor on emergency basis under certain circumstances, etc. Amends Ch. 744, 737.2065. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably

### SB 90 (2R) by Senator Lawson and others-

**Herbert F. Morgan Building**; designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 106 (2R) by Senator Constantine—

State Retirement Program; provides that disability of employee who works in another state full time may be certified by physicians licensed in that state; increases size of State Retirement Commission from three to five members; revises quorum requirements of commission. Amends 121.091,.22,.24. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 116 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others—

**Culpable Negligence/Vehicles/DUI;** provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to commit culpable negligence by driving vehicle under influence of alcohol or drugs while accompanied in vehicle by person younger than specified age. Amends 784.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/SB 122 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Saunders and others—

Homestead Exemption/Fraudulent Act; provides value-based sliding scale of criminal penalties applicable to claimant who knowingly & willfully gives false information for purpose of claiming homestead exemption if funds for homestead were obtained by commission of fraudulent act. Amends 196.131. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### CS/SB 152 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Siplin—

Alimony; authorizes court to modify payment of alimony if there is proof by preponderance of evidence that recipient former spouse is in de facto marriage with person of opposite sex outside of legal bond of matrimony; prescribes factors to be considered by court; provides for application. Amends 61.14. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

#### SB 166 (2R) by Senator Aronberg and others—

**Child Support**; requires DOR to establish by rule a method that uses reasonable efforts to locate persons to whom collections or refunds are owed, including disclosing information on Internet. Amends 409.2558. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### CS/SB 200 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Constantine—

Hazardous Material Right-to-Know Act; redesignates act as "Emergency Planning Community Right-to-Know Act"; updates reference to federal list of hazardous substances for which Community Affairs Dept. collects fees that fund emergency planning & community right-to-know programs. Amends 252.81,.85. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Domestic Security and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

#### SB 238 (2R) by Senator Campbell-

**Personal Injury Protection Insurance**; defines terms "biometric" & "biometric time date technology"; revises procedures re use of biometric time date technology for purpose of documenting claims & making payments under personal injury protection benefits. Amends 627.732,.736. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

### CS/SB 246 (2R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Hill—

**Child Safety;** requires school boards to promulgate policies re release of children; provides definition; requires copies of policies to be provided to DOE; requires nonpublic schools, private schools, & certain child care facilities to promulgate policies re release of children; requires making such policies available on premises of schools or child care facilities; provides definition. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 268 (2R) by Senator Posey-

**Elections/Early Voting**; changes day on which early voting ends. Amends 101.657. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

#### SB 292 (2R) by the Committee on Agriculture-

Citrus Canker Eradication; repeals s. 4 of ch. 2002-11, Laws of Florida; abrogates repeal of provision which defines term "exposed to infection" for purposes for eradicating citrus canker disease. Abrogates repeal of 581.184(1)(b). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture

### SB 300 (2R) by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations—

**Taxation**; repeals s. 11, ch. 2000-312, Laws of Florida; abrogates expiration of provisions in specified provisions, re Revenue Dept. passing upon & ordering refunds of property taxes, taxpayer contest proceedings against dept., procedures by which dept. may resolve disputes re assessment of taxes, interest, & penalties, exemption from tax on intangible personal property for leasehold estates in governmental property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 310 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

**Bingo Games/Electronic Use;** authorizes use of electronics or other technology in lieu of vocal verification for bingo games. Amends 849.0931. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

# CS/CS/SB 436 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Peaden and others—

Protection of Persons/Use of Force; authorizes person to use force, including deadly force, against intruder or attacker in dwelling, residence, or vehicle under specified circumstances; provides that person is justified in using deadly force under certain circumstances; provides immunity from criminal prosecution or civil action for using deadly force; defines term "criminal prosecution", etc. Creates 776.013,.032; amends 776.012,.031. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

### CS/SB 474 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Saunders—

**Nurses/Home Visits**; revises requirements for home visits by registered nurses; deletes mandatory requirement for monthly visits; requires that patient be notified of availability of optional visits. Amends 400.506. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

### CS/SB 478 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Clary—

Podiatric Medicine; requires hospital having podiatric residency program to annually provide Podiatric Medicine Board with certain information; revises time period during which podiatric physician may continue as unlicensed resident in residency program; permits resident podiatric physician to prescribe certain medications under certain circumstances; provides penalty; requires board to adopt rules to administer this act, etc. Amends 461.014. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

### SB 516 (2R) by Senator Alexander and others-

**Citrus Department/Districts**; revises & reorganizes citrus districts of state; establishes four such districts; specifies counties within each district. Amends 601.09. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 574 (2R) by Senator Haridopolos and others-

Official Fruit of Florida; designates orange as official fruit of State of Florida. Creates 15.0315. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Agriculture and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

### SB 1334 (2R) by Senator Pruitt-

Official Florida Statutes; adopts Florida Statutes 2005 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2005 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 2004 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2005 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421,.2422,.2424,.2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

# CS/SB 1336 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Calendar and Senator Pruitt—

Florida Statutes; deletes provisions that have expired, have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded; replaces incorrect cross-references & citations; corrects grammatical, typographical, & like errors; removes inconsistencies, redundancies, & unnecessary repetition in statutes; improves clarity of statutes & facilitates their correct interpretation, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine dia

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

#### SB 1338 (2R) by Senator Pruitt-

Florida Statutes; repeals specified provisions, all of which provisions have become inoperative by noncurrent repeal or expiration & , pursuant to s. 11.242(5)(b) & (i), may be omitted from Florida Statutes 2005 only through reviser's bill duly enacted by Legislature; repeals specified provision to confirm October 2, 2004, repeal of exemption in accordance with Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995, etc. Repeals & Amends FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

#### SB 1340 (2R) by Senator Pruitt-

**Florida Statutes**; amends provisions to conform to directive in s. 1, ch. 93-199, Laws of Florida, to remove gender-specific references applicable to human beings from Florida Statutes without substantive change in legal effect. Amends FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

#### SB 1376 (2R) by Senator Clary-

**Dedicated License Trust Fund/FWC**; re-creates said trust fund within Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission without modification; carries forward current balances & continues current sources & uses thereof. Effective Date: 11/04/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

### SB 1378 (2R) by Senator Clary-

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
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
