Initiatives/60 Percent of Electors; constitutional amendment to require that any proposed amendment to or revision of State Constitution, whether proposed by Legislature, by initiative, or by any other method, must be approved by at least 60 percent of voters of state voting on measure, rather than by simple majority, etc. Amends s. 5, Art. XI.

HJR 1727 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary (JC), Representative Simmons and others—

Constitution Amendments/Initiative; constitutional amendment to provide that revision or amendment proposed by initiative must amend or repeal existing section of Constitution on same subject & matter; must address basic or fundamental right of citizen of this state; or must change basic structure of govt. as established in Articles II, III, IV, or V of Constitution, except that no revision or amendment may deprive branches of govt. of any existing powers, etc. Amends s. 3, Art. XI.

Substituted for **CS/SJR 4 (SUB)** (King), read the second time and amended on May 2, 2005

HJR 1741 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary (JC), Representative Simmons and others—

State Taxes or Fees; constitutional amendment to require approval by at least two-thirds of voters of state voting in election on any proposed amendment or revision to State Constitution imposing or authorizing imposition of any new tax or fee, increasing or authorizing increase in any existing tax or fee, or imposing significant fiscal impact on state, counties, school districts, municipalities, or special districts, etc. Amends s. 7, Art. XI.

Substituted for **CS/SJR 2200 (SUB)** (Atwater), read the second time and amended on May 2, 2005

HB 1471 (3R) by Representative Goodlette and others—

Petition Fraud/Voter Protection Act; provides for certain petitions to be verified by certain method; requires certain provisions to be satisfied before signature on petition may be counted; revises requirements for placement of constitutional amendments proposed by initiative on ballot for general election; provides for regulation of initiative petition circulators, etc. Amends Chs. 99, 100, 101, 104. Effective Date: 08/01/2005.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1996 (SUB)** (Alexander), read the second time and amended on May 2, 2005

CS/SB 2568 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Webster and others—

Liability for Products; defines terms; provides that seller of product manufactured in United States may be dismissed from action for strict liability for harm caused by product; provides exceptions; provides procedures re dismissal; requires affidavit to accompany motion to dismiss; prescribes contents of affidavit; provides for discovery & hearing on motion to dismiss; authorizes certain claims for indemnification & contribution by builders, etc. Creates 768.1259. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on May 5, 2005

Compare to **HB 1513 (HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Consumer Services, and Judiciary

CS/SB 2564 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Webster and others—

Class Actions Lawsuits; provides requirements for capacity to file class action; limits actions to Florida residents; provides exceptions; provides requirements for monetary relief; eliminates private class action recovery of statutory penalties & other forms of monetary relief other than actual damages; provides monetary relief; provides for availability of nonmonetary relief; provides no effect on class action lawsuits involving civil rights laws. Creates 774.01. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

HB 1931 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary (JC), Representative Simmons and others—

Negligence; provides that person seeking damages for slip & fall on transitory foreign substance in commercial establishment must prove that said establishment had actual knowledge of condition or constructive knowledge of condition; redefines term "negligence cases" as it relates to comparative fault to include claims for negligent security in which defendant is sued for failing to prevent commission of intentional tort, etc. Amends & Reenacts FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2566 (SUB)** (Webster), read the second time and amended on May 5, 2005

CS/CS/SB 1488 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Garcia and others—

Property Insurance; revises retention of losses for which insurer is not entitled to reimbursement from Fla. Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; provides additional legislative intent re Citizens Property Insurance Corp.; requires creation of Market Accountability Advisory Comm. to assist the corporation for certain purposes; prohibits insurers from canceling or nonrenewing residential property ins. policies under certain emergency circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Effective Date: Contingent.

CS/CS/SB 838 (3R) by the Committees on Ways and Means, Health Care, Senator Peaden and others—

Medicaid; requires AHCA to contract with vendor to monitor & evaluate clinical practice patterns of providers; requires that agency, in partnership with Elderly Affairs Dept., develop integrated, fixed-payment delivery system for Medicaid recipients age 60 & older; requires agency to coordinate with other entities to create emergency room diversion programs for Medicaid recipients, etc. Amends Ch. 409; creates 409.91211. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

HB 1325 (3R) by Representative Attkisson—

Local Govt. Economic Development; specifies criteria for certification for remaining available certification slot for professional sports franchises; provides for notice of public hearings to consider whether local government will provide communications service; sets pricing standards; limits use of eminent-domain powers; requires local governmental provider of communications services to follow same prohibitions as other providers of same services, etc. Amends 288.1162. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB's 2072 & 1714 (SUB)** (Constantine), read the second time and amended on May 4, 2005

SB 342 (3R) by Senator Argenziano—

Jai Alai/Live Performances; redefines term "full schedule of live racing or games" for certain jai alai permitholders; provides amount of license fees & taxes for jai alai permitholder that conducts fewer than certain number of live performances in any calendar year. Amends 550.002,.09511. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on May 5, 2005

CS/CS/SB 486 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Senator Dockery—

Phosphate Mine Reclamation; deletes obsolete provision re use of reclamation funds; deletes obsolete provision authorizing DEP to expend certain funds; requires financial responsibility for wetlands mitigation; specifies financial responsibility demonstration for permitted activities occurring over period of 3 years or more of mining activities; extends due date of Peace River Basin study. Amends 378.034,.035, 373.414. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on May 4, 2005

CS/SB 718 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Sebesta—

Transportation Department; authorizes dept. to adopt rules governing leasing of property for joint public-private development; grants local governments authority to issue permits allowing limited temporary use of state transportation right-of-way; establishes maximum limit on state-funded infrastructure bank loans to State Transportation TF; revises requirements for projects intended to mitigate adverse effects of transportation projects; etc. Amends Chs. 337, 339, 373. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time on April 20, 2005

CS/SB 1344 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Sebesta and others—

Motor Vehicles; provides that unauthorized use of traffic signal preemption device is moving violation; provides clearance specifications for railroad-highway grade crossing; deletes requirement that portion of certain fees collected by tax collector be deposited in Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund; provides 4 points to be assessed against person's driver's license for violation of certain provision, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

CS/SB 2070 (3R) by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities and Senator Constantine—

Communications Services; specifies period during which actual cost of operating substitute communications system is exempt from such taxes; creates Communications Service Tax Task Force; provides that definition of sales price for purposes of communication services tax does not include specified charges for Internet access services; provides for emergency rulemaking by DOR, etc. Amends 202.11,.13,.17,.26, 212.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Telecommunications; specifies exclusive jurisdiction of PSC to regulate telecommunications companies; requires that broadband service remain free of state & local regulation; provides that damage to equipment & facilities as result of named tropical system constitutes compelling showing of changed circumstances to justify rate increase; requires company to exhaust any storm-reserve funds prior to recovery from customers, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

Similar to **HB 1649 (HC)** in the Committees on Communications and Public Utilities, Commerce and Consumer Services, Government Efficiency Appropriations, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

SB 2000 (SO) by Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Domestic Security; provides requirements for security assessments of buildings, facilities, or structures owned or leased by state agencies, state universities, & community colleges; requires that security needs be prioritized; requires that assessments be completed before construction, occupancy, or modification of building, facility or structure, etc. Amends 943.0311. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Domestic Security, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Education

Lehman, Congressman William; recognizes not only the exemplary life that Congressman Bill Lehman led, but also recognizes the unforgettable legacy that he leaves behind.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

SB 80 (2R) by Senator Geller-

Parent-child Privilege; creates parent-child privilege to prevent disclosure of communications that were made by children younger than specified age to their parents or by parents older than specified age to their children & intended to be made in confidence; prescribes proceedings in which privilege does not exist; requires that guardian ad litem be appointed to represent minor child prior to court's approving child's waiver of privilege, etc. Creates 90.5045. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Children and Families

SB 90 (2R) by Senator Lawson and others-

Herbert F. Morgan Building; designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 100 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others-

Health Care Practitioners/Education; deletes requirements for Health Dept. to administer electronic continuing education tracking system for health care practitioners; provides rulemaking authority; continues education requirements required for license renewal; authorizes citations & fines to be imposed for failure to comply with required continuing education requirements, etc. Amends 456.025,.072; creates 456.0251. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health Care and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 116 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others—

Culpable Negligence/Vehicles/DUI; provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to commit culpable negligence by driving vehicle under influence of alcohol or drugs while accompanied in vehicle by person younger than specified age. Amends 784.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/SB 118 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Saunders—

Massage Therapy Regulation; exempts certain settings where massage therapy is rendered from licensure & inspection requirements for massage establishments. Amends 480.034. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 122 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Saunders and others—

Homestead Exemption/Fraudulent Act; provides value-based sliding scale of criminal penalties applicable to claimant who knowingly & willfully gives false information for purpose of claiming homestead exemption if funds for homestead were obtained by commission of fraudulent act. Amends 196.131. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 208 (2R) by Senator Lynn-

Child Care Facilities; requires applicant, owner, or operator of said facility to sign affidavit attesting to accuracy of certain information; requires family day care homes that are required to be licensed & large family child care homes to have license that is renewed annually; authorizes local licensing agency or CFS Dept. to issue provisional license or registration to child care facility, family day care home, or large family child care home, etc. Amends Ch. 402. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Children and Families, and Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 210 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Children and Families, Senator Lynn and others—

Suicide Prevention Statewide Office; creates Statewide Off. for Suicide Prevention in Executive Off. of Governor; creates position of statewide coordinator for statewide office, contingent upon specific appropriation; creates Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council within Statewide Off. for Suicide Prevention; creates interagency workgroup for state agencies within coordinating council in order to coordinate state agency plans for suicide prevention, etc. Creates 14.2019,.20195. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 232 (2R) by the Committee on Domestic Security and Senator Constantine—

Emergency Management; provides that it is policy of Legislature to encourage counties & municipalities to explore use of emerging technologies for purpose of disseminating information to public before, during, & after emergency or natural disaster; authorizes county or municipality to establish volunteer disaster assistance recovery program, etc. Amends 252.32,.38. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Domestic Security and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 268 (2R) by Senator Posey-

Elections/Early Voting; changes day on which early voting ends. Amends 101.657. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

CS/SB 298 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Lynn—

Notaries Public; authorizes notaries to charge per notarized signature; prohibits notaries from charging specified persons for acts re application for benefit resulting from public service. Amends 117.05. Effective Date: 01/01/2006.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/CS/CS/SB 304 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Banking and Insurance and Senator Sebesta—

Financial Entities & Transactions; authorizes Financial Svcs. Comm. to require electronic submission of forms, documents, or fees; clarifies application of exemption from application of specified mortgage broker licensure requirements to certain entities; imposes certain costs & fees on mortgage lender that fails to pay property owner's tax or insurance premiums from escrow account; increases reimbursement charge for certain investigation costs, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

SB 312 (2R) by Senator Fasano and others-

Prisoners/Sale of Literary Accounts; defines terms concerning sale of literary accounts & memorabilia by & on behalf of convicted felon; provides for lien in favor of state on proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts, materials, & memorabilia payable to or accruing to convicted felon, representative of convicted felon, or profiteer of felony; provides for distribution of proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts or memorabilia, etc. Amends 944.512, 960.291. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 352 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator Lynn and others—

Zaniyah Hinson Act; provides for child care program affiliated with religious congregation or religious school to be exempt from regulation by CFS Dept. as religious-exempt child care program; requires said programs to display certificate of compliance issued by an accrediting agency recognized by dept.; provides requirements for said agencies recognized by dept.; requires said agency to conduct initial onsite review, etc. Amends 402.316. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 378 (2R) by the Committee on Education Appropriations and Senator Alexander—

Higher Education/Florida State Univ.; eliminates provisions requiring annual distribution of funds to Florida State University for specified purpose. Amends 561.121. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Appropriations and the Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 440 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Senator Dockery—


