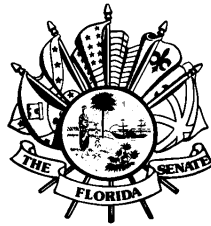

Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

SB 1824 (2R) by Senator Aronberg—

Probate; revises procedures re opening decedent's safe-deposit box; revises procedures re granting access to safe-deposit boxes leased in two or more names; revises provisions re time of filing or withdrawing certain estate share elections; revises procedures re filing petitions for determinations of exempt property; revises procedures & requirements re notices of administration & petitions for relief, etc. Amends 655.935-.937, 732.2135,.402, 733.212,.6065. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

CS/SB 1834 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Baker—

Sexual Predators; prohibits sexual predator from possessing prescription drugs for purpose of treating erectile dysfunction; provides criminal penalties. Creates 794.075. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Health Care

CS/SB 1870 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Baker—

Pawnbroking/Local Ordinances/Fees; provides that local ordinances may not require payment of any fee or tax re pawn transaction or purchase unless authorized under Fla. Pawnbroking Act. Amends 539.001. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 1922 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Peadar—

State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Prog.; revises provisions re qualifications of State Long-Term Care Ombudsman; revises duties & responsibilities of said ombudsman; revises duties & membership of State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Council; authorizes Secretary of Elderly Affairs to recommend to Governor appointments for at-large positions on state council; requires rules for receiving, investigating, & assessing complaints against long-term care facilities, etc. Amends Ch. 400. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 1948 (2R) by Senator Smith and others—

Airboats; defines terms "airboat" & "muffler"; conforms terminology; provides for regulation of airboat operation & equipment; requires sound-muffling device & display of flags, as described; provides penalties; prohibits ordinance or local law from discriminating against airboats; provides for mandatory education; corrects cross-references & conforms terminology, etc. Amends FS. Corporation Not for Profit/Self-ins.; authorizes two or more corporations not for profit to form self-insurance fund for certain purposes; provides specific requirements. Creates 624.4624. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

CS/SB 2000 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Posey—

Ethics/Public Officers & Employees; prohibits employees of state & its political subdivisions from participating in political campaign; prohibits certain disclosures or use by former public officer, agency employee, or local government attorney; clarifies that existing postemployment restrictions apply to certain agency employees; specifies how assets & liabilities valued in excess of \$1,000 are to be reported by reporting individual, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and withdrawn from the Committees on Judiciary, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Rules and Calendar

SB 2006 (2R) by Senator Webster and others—

Damage Apportionment/Civil Actions; deletes exceptions to requirement for liability based on percentage of fault instead of joint & several liability; provides applicability. Amends 768.81. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2034 (2R) by the Committee on Education Appropriations and Senator Baker—

Education/Spouses/Disabled Veterans; provides that it is declared policy of state to provide educational opportunity at state expense for spouses of deceased or disabled servicemembers; provides criteria for qualification for such benefits for unremarried spouses of deceased servicemembers & dependent spouses of disabled servicemembers; specifies uses of funds appropriated for such educational opportunities; revises terminology, etc. Amends Ch. 295. CS/CS/SB 2060 (2R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Clary—

Architecture & Interior Design; defines term "responsible supervising control"; authorizes Board of Architecture & Interior Design to adopt certain rules; authorizes certain architects to use title "Architect, Retired"; authorizes certain interior designers to use title "Interior Designer, Retired". Amends 481.203,.205,.223. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 2068 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others—

Early Voting; provides for supervisor of elections to file request with Division of Elections of Dept. of State to designate additional early voting sites; provides requirements for such request; requires that division receive public comment on proposed early voting sites; specifies timeframe within which division must approve or disapprove request for additional sites; revises time when early voting sites are required to be open. Amends 101.657. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/SB 2188 (2R) by the Committees on Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Mediation; provides standards for conduct of mediation; provides for role of mediator & counsel in specified mediations; requires referral of certain cases to mediation; prohibits certain cases from being referred to mediation; requires Supreme Court to maintain list of certified mediators; requires court in certain family law cases to make mediation referrals in accordance with statute governing court-ordered mediation, etc. Amends Ch. 44, 61.183. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

CS/CS/SB 2238 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Aronberg—

License Plates; creates Homeownership For All license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates; conforms provision re Fla. Memorial College license plates; changes name to Fla. Memorial University license plate; authorizes maximum of 10 percent of proceeds from sale of Keep Kids Drug Free license plates to be used for marketing & certain administrative costs. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 2336 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Speed-limit Violations; provides exceptions to procedures for certain speed-limit violations; removes option for certain offenders to attend driver improvement school; provides increased penalties for certain speed-limit violations; provides for disposition of increased penalties; requires mandatory hearings for certain speed-limit violations; provides for increase in driver points for certain speed-limit violations. Amends 318.14,.18,.19, 322.27. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 2518 (2R) by the Committees on Ways and Means, Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Argenziano—

Contractual Services/State Agency; prohibits state agency from renewing or amending contract for outsourcing under certain conditions; requires that specified statement be included in procurements of commodities & services which prohibits contact between respondents & specified employees of executive & legislative branches; creates Fla. Efficient Govt. Act; defines "commercial activity" for purposes of provision authorizing release of social security numbers, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ways and Means

SB 2528 (2R) by Senator Posey—

Driver's License/Learner/Cell Phones; prohibits motor vehicle operator who holds learner's driver's license from using mobile telephone or personal communications device while operating vehicle; provides penalty. Amends 322.1615. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

CS/SB 2548 (2R) by the Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Carlton—

State Financial Matters; provides for moneys collected from sale of Florida Statutes or other publications to be deposited in specified trust fund; requires Chief Justice of Supreme Court to develop program monitoring plans; revises requirements for information re performance measures to be included in long-range program plans of state agencies & judicial branch; repeals provision re classification of Chief Financial Officer's warrants, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006 except as otherwise provided.

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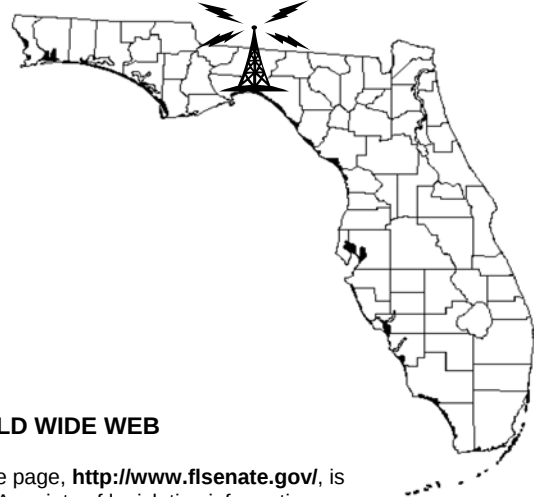
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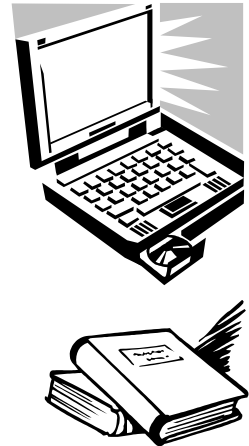
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
