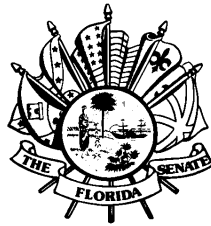

Tax Benefit/Catastrophic Emergencies; includes as infrastructure any fixed capital expenditure or fixed capital outlay associated with improvement of certain private facilities that owner agrees to make available as public emergency shelter or staging area for emergency response equipment during emergencies declared by state or local government; requires that improvements be limited to those necessary to meet current standards for emergency evacuation shelters, etc. Amends 212.055. SB 356 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Guardianship/Court Monitors; excepts contesting of trust validity by property guardians of incapacitated grantors from prohibition against commencing certain actions; authorizes court to determine which persons may inspect certain orders or reports; authorizes court to enter any order necessary to protect ward or ward's estate; authorizes court to appoint court monitor on emergency basis under certain circumstances, etc. Amends 737.2065, Ch. 744. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Creates 744.1076. Effective Date: Contingent.

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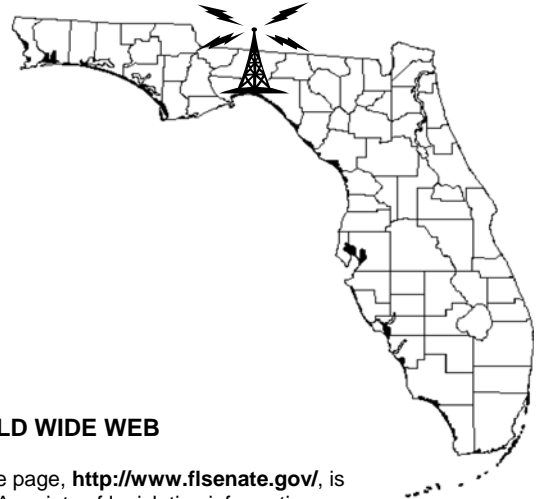
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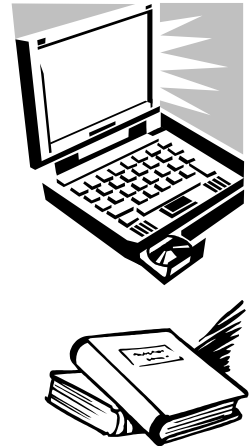
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
