**Property Appraiser Assessments**; revises property appraisers' authority for inspecting real property for assessment purposes in addition to physical inspections; reduces required frequency of physical inspections. Amends 193.023. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

#### SB 266 (3R) by Senator Fasano—

Athletic Trainers/Licensure; revises requirements for licensure as athletic trainer; provides that person employed as apprentice trainer or athletic trainer is not exempt from specified provisions; deletes classification of first responder in school district's athletic injuries prevention & treatment program; requires that athletic trainer employed by school district be licensed as athletic trainer, etc. Amends 468.707,.711,.723, 1012.46. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

#### SB 1768 (3R) by Senator Pruitt-

Official Florida Statutes; adopts Florida Statutes 2006 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Fla. Statutes only through reviser's bill duly enacted by Legislature; amends provisions to conform to repeal of specified provisions. Amends FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

**Automated External Defibrillators**; requires certain high schools to have said defibrillator on school grounds; encourages public & private partnerships to cover certain costs associated with said defibrillators. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

### SB 1270 (SO) by Senator Margolis—

**Advisory Council on Condominiums**; requires that council review certain provisions re protections for purchasers of condominium conversions; requires report to Legislature. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries and Judiciary

### SB 542 (SO) by Senator Jones-

**Birth-Related Neurological Injury;** requires administrative law judge to determine whether factual determinations re required notice to obstetrical patients of participation in plan are satisfied; provides exclusive jurisdiction to make such determinations; provides legislative intent; authorizes State Board of Administration to invest & reinvest funds held on behalf of plan pursuant to certain requirements. Amends 766.309, 315. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Health Care

## CS/SB 1506 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Alexander—

Insurance/Electronic Statements; amends specified provisions re viatical settlement providers, premium finance companies, & continuing care providers to authorize Financial Services Commission to require by rule that certain statements or filings be submitted by electronic means in certain format; authorizes Office of Insurance Regulation to require that certain records or copies be submitted by remote electronic access. Amends 626.9913,.99175, 627.836, 628.281, 651.026,.0261. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

## CS/SB 648 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—


