Homestead Property; provides conditions under which changes, additions, or improvements that replace all or portion of said property damaged or destroyed by misfortune or calamity shall not be assessed at just value; provides conditions under which homestead property that is damaged or destroyed by misfortune or calamity & is uninhabitable on January 1 after damage or destruction occurs may be granted homestead exemption, etc. Amends 193.155, 196.031. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 28, 2006

HB 147 (3R) by Representative Kravitz and others—

Criminal Prosecutions; prescribes rights of prosecution in closing arguments; repeals Rule 3.250, Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure, re accused as a witness & being entitled to concluding arguments before the jury, to extent of inconsistency with act. Creates 918.19. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **SB 658 (SUB)** (Wise), read the second time on April 28, 2006, read the third time on May 1, 2006, failed to receive the required 2/3 vote for passage, reconsidered and place on third reading

CS/SB 854 (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Carlton—

Taxation; revises exceptions applicable to damaged or destroyed homestead property to requirement that changes, additions, or improvements to said property be assessed at just value under certain circumstances; provides for continued granting of homestead exemption for certain damaged or destroyed said property under certain circumstances; requires DOR to study state's property tax structure, etc. Amends 193.155, 196.031. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2006

Identical to **HB 7109 (HC)** in the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Community Affairs, General Government Appropriations, and Ways and Means

CS/CS/SJR 1436 (3R) by the Committees on Ways and Means, Government Efficiency Appropriations, Senator Atwater and others—

Tax or Fee Limitations; constitutional amendment re state tax or fee limitations, to specify application to imposition of new state taxes or fees, an increase or decrease in or elimination of existing state taxes or fees, & imposition of significant financial impact on state government. Amends s. 7, Art. XI.

Read the second time on April 28, 2006

Compare to **HB 7037 (HC)** in the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Ways and Means, and Rules and Calendar

HJR 631 (3R) by Representative Sansom and others—

Homestead Tax/Disabled Veteran/WW II; constitutional amendment to provide discount from amount of ad valorem tax on homestead of partially or totally permanently disabled veteran of WW II who was Florida resident at time of entering military service, whose disability was combat-related, & who was honorably discharged; to specify percentage of discount as equal to percentage of veteran's permanent service-connected disability, etc. Amends s. 6, Art. VII.

Substituted for **CS/SJR 194 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 382 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Margolis—

Wellness Program for State Employees; defines term "aged-based & gender-based benefits" for purposes of state group insurance program; creates Florida State Employee Wellness Council within DMS; provides for membership; provides for reimbursement of per diem & travel expenses; provides purpose & duties of council. Amends 110.123. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

HB 263 (3R) by Representative Mealor and others—

Florida Prepaid College Program; renames said program; authorizes funds in Fla. Prepaid Tuition Scholarship Program to be used for certain approved scholarship programs; deletes restriction on types of postsecondary educational institutions to which qualified beneficiary may apply his or her benefits under said program; requires direct-support organization of Fla. Prepaid College Board to administer said program, etc. Amends 1009.97,.972,.98,.983, 732.402. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 550 (SUB)** (Baker) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1920 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary (Webster)—

Wrongful Incarceration Compensation; authorizes certain individuals to petition court to determine whether they were actually innocent; provides criteria for determining whether person was actually innocent; authorizes actually innocent person to apply to Financial Services Dept. for compensation; provides for compensation exceeding certain amount to be paid in installments over 10-year period; requires release & waiver of any claims against state prior to payment of compensation, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

HB 1029 (3R) by Representative Baxley and others—

National Forests/Firearms; repeals provision which prohibits carrying of firearms in national forests; repeals provision which authorizes granting of special permit for carrying of firearms in said forest; repeals provision which provides penalty for violation of certain provisions; requires DEP to amend correlative rule in Fla. Administrative Code to allow possession of weapons in compliance with all Fla. Statutes, etc. Amends 790.25; repeals 790.11,.12,.14. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1546 (SUB)** (Posey) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1136 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator King and others—

Innovation Incentive Prog/**Pub. Rec.**; expands public-records exemption for incentive programs to include said program under specified provision; provides for future review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Amends 288.1067. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

Identical to **HB 1285 (HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Consumer Services, Community Affairs, Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Ways and Means, and Rules and Calendar

CS/CS/SB 1226 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation, Senators Dockery, Clary and others—

Land Acquisition; provides that taxes distributed to pay debt service on Preservation 2000 bonds, Florida Forever bonds, & Save Our Everglades bonds shall, under specified circumstances, be collectively distributed on pro rata basis; directs Acquisition & Restoration Council to also give priority consideration to acquisition of lands that protect & buffer military installations; creates Babcock Ranch Preserve Act, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

HB 7055 (3R) by the Committee on Economic Development, Trade & Banking (CC) and Representative Bilirakis—

Enterprise Zones; reenacts periodic review requirement; provides for future expiration; limits exemption by refund of certain taxes for rehabilitation of certain property in said zone; revises information requirement for claiming enterprise zone jobs tax credit; provides meeting notice requirement for governing body adopting enterprise zone boundary change resolution; provides for retroactive application & future repeal, etc. Amends Chs. 212, 220, 195.099, 290.0055. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1132 (SUB)** (King), read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1366 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Atwater—

Radiologist Assistants; redesignates specified provisions as "Radiological Personnel Classification Act"; provides for identification & duties of said assistant; provides conditions for qualification for radiologist assistant's certificate; authorizes DOH to issue certificates by endorsement to certain said assistants; adds certified radiologist assistant to membership of Advisory Council on Radiation Protection, etc. Amends Ch. 468. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

Identical to **HB 819 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Care and Health and Human Services Appropriations

HB 7127 (3R) by the Committee on Military & Veteran Affairs (SAC), Representative Jordan and others—

Disturbance of Assemblies; provides penalty for willfully interrupting or disturbing assembly of people met for purpose of acknowledging death of individual with military funeral honors detail; reenacts provision re indictments or informations for disturbing assembly, for purpose of incorporating amendment in reference thereto. Amends 871.01; reenacts 871.02. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 218 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

HB 293 (3R) by Representatives Pickens, Brown and others—

Fiscally Constrained Counties; provides for distribution of tax revenue to fiscally constrained counties; provides for transitional emergency distribution from Local Government Half-cent Sales Tax Clearing Trust Fund to certain fiscally constrained counties; provides for distribution of additional funds to certain fiscally constrained counties; provides for use of funds, etc. Amends 212.20, 218.65, 288.1169, 985.2155; creates 218.67. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1612 (SUB)** (Baker), read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1194 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Constantine—

Growth Management; creates "Interlocal Service Boundary Agreement Act"; provides legislative intent re annexation & coordination of services by local governments; provides for creation of said agreements by county & one or more municipalities or independent special districts; requires that emergency medical services be provided by existing provider to annexed area with certain exceptions; creates "Florida Impact Fee Act", etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/CS/CS/SB 2114 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Care and the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Garcia)—

Motor Vehicle Insurance; specifies information to be included in crash report; provides additional circumstance re insurance crimes for mandatory revocation of person's driver's license; revises provisions specifying material omission & insurance fraud; prohibits scheming to create documentation of motor vehicle crash that did not occur; abrogates repeal of provisions pertaining to Fla. Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law, etc. Amends 316.068, 322.26, 817.234,.2361. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/CS/CS/SB 2112 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Criminal Justice and the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Garcia)—

Health Care Clinics; redefines term "clinic" for purposes of Health Care Clinic Act to include certain additional providers; includes specialty clinics within requirements for license renewal, transfer of ownership, & provisional licensure; requires health care clinics & specialty clinics to display signs containing certain info. re insurance fraud; designates Florida Center for Nursing as "Florida Barbara B. Lumpkin Center for Nursing", etc. Amends Ch. 400, 456.072. Effective Date: 01/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/CS/SB 142 (3R) by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Senator Fasano and others—

Telecommunications/Price Regulation; allows telecommunications company to publicly publish price lists for nonbasic services; provides additional authority to Public Counsel, including authority to provide legal representation to, & appear on behalf of, state & its political subdivisions as consumers of communications services & utility services, to receive, investigate, & take legal action upon complaints involving said services not within jurisdiction of PSC, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities and Senator Constantine—

Telecommunications Carriers; provides for local exchange telecommunications company to request waiver of its carrier of last resort obligation from PSC; provides additional authority to Public Counsel, including authority to provide legal representation to, & to appear on behalf of, state & its political subdivisions as consumers of communications services & utility services, to receive, investigate, & take legal action upon complaints involving said services, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1560 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Margolis—

Psychology Specialties; provides definition; specifies circumstances under which psychologist may hold himself or herself out as certified psychology specialist or psychology diplomate; requires Psychology Board to adopt rules & establish specified criteria for approval of certifying bodies; specifies that psychologist licensed under specified provisions may specify types of services he or she provides. Creates 490.0149. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

Similar to HB 775 (HC) in the Committee on Health Care

CS/SB 2118 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Garcia)—

Workers' Comp. Joint Underwriting; provides requirements for joint underwriting plan of insurers which operates as Fla. Workers' Compensation Joint Underwriting Association; provides for continuous review of plan; provides guidelines for procurement of goods & services, including legal services; prohibits hiring outside lobbyist; prescribes limits on representing persons or entities before plan by former senior managers or officers of plan, etc. Amends 627.311. Effective Date: 07/01/2006 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on May 1, 2006

HB 351 (3R) by Representative Lopez-Cantera and others—

Community Residential Homes; revises, provides, & deletes definitions; requires sponsoring agency of community residential home to provide certain information & notification re siting requirements to local government under certain circumstances; provides for licensing agency to deny or nullify license to operate community residential home under certain circumstances. Amends 419.001. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1006 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

CS/CS/SB 1196 (3R) by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Community Affairs and Senator Constantine—

Florida Impact Fee Act; creates said act; requires that impact fee meet certain specified requirements concerning calculation of fee, affordable housing, accounting for revenues & expenditures, provision of notice, & collection of administrative costs; requires inclusion of affidavit certifying compliance with act in certain audits of financial statements of local government entity or school board provided to Auditor General, etc. Creates 163.31801. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

CS/SB 1362 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Atwater—

Nurses/Operating Rooms; requires hospitals to meet requirements of federal regulation re registered nurses performing circulating duties in operating rooms; requires circulating nurses to be present in operating rooms during specified times. Amends 395.0191. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on May 1, 2006

Similar to **HB 483 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Care and Health and Human Services Appropriations

HB 7237 (3R) by the Committee on Utilities & Telecommunications (CC) and Representative Littlefield—

Public Service Commission; revises provisions for terms of commissioners on said commission; removes provision for governance of Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight; repeals provision re qualifications of Chief Auditor of commission; deletes certain provisions re employment of reporters & furnishing of transcripts by commission; removes exception for railroads from certain audits by commission, etc. Amends Ch. 350, 361.08; repeals 350.051,.80. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1872 (SUB)** (Constantine), read the second time and amended on May 1, 2006

HB 1079 (3R) by Representative Altman and others—

Sales Tax Exemption/Advertising; defines term "qualified aircraft"; includes said aircraft under certain miscellaneous exemption provisions re aircraft; exempts from tax on sales, use, & other transactions certain advertising materials distributed free of charge by mail in an envelope; provides criteria, requirements, & limitations on exemptions for purchases or leases of said aircraft. Amends 212.02,.08; creates 212.0801. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1832 (SUB)** (Haridopolos) and read the second time on May 1, 2006

CS/CS/SB 2234 (SO) by the Committee on Education and the Committee on Judiciary (Webster)—

Education/Failing Schools; expresses intent of Legislature to create program to enhance failing schools; requires Education Commissioner to develop & submit such program to Legislature; provides scholarship eligibility to students receiving opportunity scholarships during 2005-2006 school year for limited amount of time; prescribes obligations of school districts to inform parents about failing schools, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 256 (SO) by the Committees on Government Efficiency Appropriations, Judiciary, Senator King and others—

Scholarship Program Accountability; amends provisions re John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program; revises student eligibility requirements for receipt of scholarship & restricts eligibility therefor; revises & adds school district obligations & clarifies parental options; provides funding & payment requirements for former Fla. School for Deaf & Blind students & for students exiting DJJ program, etc. Amends 1002.39, 220.187; creates 1002.421. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably, with seven amendments, by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committees on Education Appropriations and Ways and Means

Similar to **HB 7041 (HC)** in the Committees on Education, Judiciary, Government Efficiency Appropriations, Education Appropriations, and Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 472 (SO) by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary and Senator Saunders—

Guardianship; authorizes revocation or suspension of guardian's registration; provides that Statewide Public Guardianship Office need not review credit & criminal investigations from college or university before registering institution as professional guardian; provides that guardian, with approval of court, may amend revocable trust of property of ward; revises circumstances under which guardian may be removed, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committee on Justice Appropriations

CS/SB 474 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Saunders—

Statewide Guardianship Off./Pub. Rec; creates exemption from public-records requirements for identifying information of persons making donation of funds or property to direct-support organization of Statewide Public Guardianship Office; provides for review & repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act; provides statement of public necessity. Amends 744.7082. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/CS/SB 132 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Bennett and others—

Affordable Housing; requires county & municipal staff to prepare inventory list of all real property to which county or municipality holds fee simple title by specified date & triennially thereafter; requires planning staff to identify real property that is appropriate for use as said housing; revises certain provisions re Everglades restoration bonds; provides that Homeownership Assistance Program may assist moderate-income persons, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committees on Ways and Means, and Rules and Calendar

Compare to **HB 1363 (HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Banking and Insurance, Judiciary, and Ways and Means

CS/SB 2522 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Posey—

Insurance; defines insurance for debt cancellation products for purposes of Fla. Insurance Code; provides that debt cancellation products offered by financial institutions do not constitute insurance for purposes of insurance code; revises limitations on certain amounts of life insurance on debtor; revises limitation on term of credit disability insurance. Amends 624.605, 627.553, 679, 681. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably, with four amendments

Similar to **HB 1361 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Judiciary

CS/CS/SB 2384 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Government Efficiency Appropriations and Senator Dockery—

Department of State; clarifies terms of appointment to Fla. Arts Council; requires state's matching share of cultural endowment to be returned to state & deposited into Fla. Fine Arts Trust Fund rather than General Revenue Fund under certain circumstances; transfers responsibility for Fla. Historic Capitol from Dept. of State to Legislature; revises form used by each state agency for purposes of purging public mailing lists, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

Identical to **HB 7031 (HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs, Government Efficiency Appropriations, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 734 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services (King)—

Public-records Exemption/OGSR; amends provision re exemption from public-records requirements provided for information held by specified office, authorities, corporation, agencies or other business entity authorized by state, municipality or county to promote certain business interests; restates applicability of provisions re trade secrets; saves exemption from repeal under OGSR Act; deletes provisions providing for repeal of exemption, etc. Amends 288.075. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

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
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
