## BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

### BILLS ON THIRD READING

#### **CS/SB 1770, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Banking and Insurance (Simmons)—**

**Property Insurance;** Changing the name of the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund Finance Corporation to the State Board of Administration Finance Corporation; providing that Citizens Property Insurance Corporation is an insurer subject to civil actions as an agent of the state covered by sovereign immunity; reducing the value of residential structures that can be covered by the corporation; requiring the corporation to have an inspector general; authorizing an insurer to offer a reduced amount of sinkhole coverage with an appropriate reduction in premium, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in the act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

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#### **SB 1042, 1st Eng. (3R) by Senator Abruzzo—**

**Public Meetings/Criminal Justice Commissions;** Providing an exemption from public meeting requirements for that portion of a meeting of a duly constituted criminal justice commission at which specified members of the commission discuss active criminal intelligence information or active criminal investigative information currently being considered by, or which may foreseeably come before, the commission; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2013*

*Similar to **CS/HB 361(HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules*

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#### **CS/SB 964, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Abruzzo—**

**Termination of Parental Rights;** Providing that a parent's rights may be terminated if the court determines, by clear and convincing evidence, that the child was conceived during an act of unlawful sexual battery; creating a presumption that termination of parental rights is in the best interest of the child if the child was conceived as a result of an unlawful sexual battery; requiring the court to accept a guilty plea or conviction as conclusive proof that the child was conceived by a violation of criminal law, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2013, and applies to all unlawful acts of sexual battery occurring before, on, or after that date.

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#### **CS/CS/SB 972, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Transportation, Community Affairs and Senator Hukill—**

**Transportation Development;** Providing that local governments that implement transportation concurrency must allow an applicant for a development agreement to satisfy transportation concurrency requirements if certain criteria are met, and must provide the basis upon which landowners will be assessed a proportionate share of the cost of addressing certain transportation impacts; encouraging a local government that repeals transportation concurrency to adopt an alternative mobility funding system that is subject to certain requirements, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

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### **SB 1066 (3R) by Senator Richter—**

**Public Records/Dental Workforce Surveys;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information contained in dental workforce surveys submitted by dentists or dental hygienists to the Department of Health; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/HB 95 (3R) by the Committee on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Representative Holder and others—**

**Charitable Contributions;** Defines "charitable contribution" & "qualified religious or charitable entity or organization"; provides that transfer of charitable contribution that is received in good faith by qualified religious or charitable entity or organization is not fraudulent transfer; provides exceptions. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for CS/SB 102(SUB) (Detert) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/CS/SB 468, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Banking and Insurance and Senator Hukill—**

**Property and Casualty Insurance Rates, Fees, and Forms;** Postponing the date that repeals the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund emergency assessment exemption for medical malpractice insurance premiums; exempting medical malpractice insurance that covers certain providers and practitioners from specified rate filing requirements; providing for an informational filing of certain forms that are exempt from the Office of Insurance Regulation's approval process, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/HB 7065, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations Committee, State Affairs Committee, Representative Caldwell and others—**

**Everglades Improvement and Management;** Revises legislative findings for achieving water quality goals; revises definition of term "Long-Term Plan"; revises provisions for use of certain ad valorem tax proceeds; directs SFWMD to complete specified analysis; revises provisions for collection of agricultural privilege tax; provides for use of such tax proceeds; provides that payment of such tax & certain costs fulfills certain constitutional obligations; provides appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for CS/SB 768(SUB) (Simpson) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **SB 1830, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Negron)—**

**Ad Valorem Taxation;** Providing that the postmark date of commercial mail delivery service is considered the date of filing for certain ad valorem applications or returns; providing that a change of ownership for purposes of assessing property at just value does not apply to lessees entitled to the homestead; providing that aquacultural crops are exempt from taxation until marketable; deleting the express requirement that titleholders of homesteads live on the homestead in order to qualify for homestead tax exemption, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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### **HB 21 (3R) by Representative Perry and others—**

**Background Screening for Noninstructional Contractors on School Grounds;** Requires DOE to create uniform, statewide identification badge to be worn by noninstructional contractors signifying that contractor has met specified requirements; requires school district issuance & recognition of identification badge. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for SB 318(SUB) (Grimsley) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/SB 1302 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Garcia—**

**Temporary Certificates for Visiting Physicians;** Providing that a physician who has been invited by certain medical or surgical training programs or educational symposiums may be issued a temporary certificate for limited privileges solely to provide educational training; modifying criteria; revising the requirements for proof of medical malpractice insurance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/SB 1398, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Hukill—**

**Real Estate Appraisers;** Authorizing qualifying education courses completed by applicants for registration as a trainee or certification as a residential appraiser or general appraiser to be completed through distance learning; revising the education and experience requirements for certified residential appraisers and certified general appraisers according to certain real property appraiser qualification criteria adopted by the Appraiser Qualifications Board of the Appraisal Foundation on a specified date; authorizing the use of a distance learning course, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/SB 1768 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Transportation (Brandes)—**

**OGSR/Personal Information/Paratransit Services;** Amending provisions relating to an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of an applicant or recipient of paratransit services; saving the exemption from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**SB 1784, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security (Altman)—**

**Military Installations;** Authorizing the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund to acquire certain nonconservation lands to buffer a military installation against encroachment; authorizing the Department of Economic Opportunity to annually recommend nonconservation lands for acquisition through fee simple purchase or less-than-fee interest purchase to the board of trustees for the purpose of preventing the encroachment of military installations; requiring the board of trustees to also consider land acquisition recommendations of the Florida Defense Support Task Force, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/HB 623 (3R) by the Committee on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Representative Artiles and others—**

**Wine;** Provides exception to maximum allowable capacity for individual containers of wine sold in this state; provides that wine sold or offered for sale by specified vendors shall be in unopened original container. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 658(SUB) (Simpson) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/HB 537 (3R) by the Committees on Local and Federal Affairs Committee, Economic Development and Tourism Subcommittee, Representative Moraitis and others—**

**Growth Management;** Provides that initiative or referendum process for any development order is prohibited; provides that initiative or referendum process for any local comprehensive plan amendments & map amendments is prohibited; provides exception for initiative or referendum process specifically authorized by local government charter provision in effect as of June 1, 2011, for certain local comprehensive plan amendments & map amendments; provides that certain charter provisions for initiative or referendum process are not sufficient; provides legislative intent; provides that certain prohibitions apply retroactively. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 528(SUB) (Simpson), read the second time, and amended on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/HB 935 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee and Representative Young—**

**Florida False Claims Act;** Revises terminology; authorizes DLA to issue subpoenas for specified purposes before institution of civil proceedings; prohibits specified actions by person, knowing or having reason to believe that subpoena is pending; provides that state may elect to pursue available alternative remedies, including administrative proceedings; specifies what constitutes final finding or conclusion in an alternative proceeding that is binding on all parties to an action under act; revises provisions relating to dismissal of an action if substantially same allegations or transactions as alleged in action were publicly disclosed; provides for treatment for statutes of limitations purposes of pleadings filed in interventions by DLA. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

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**HB 1297 (3R) by Representative Young—**

**Pub. Rec./Florida False Claims Act;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for complaint & information held by DLA pursuant to investigation of violation relating to false claims against state; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides for specified disclosure; specifies duration of exemption; specifies conditions under which investigation is considered complete; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: On the same date that HB 935 or similar legislation takes effect

*Substituted for CS/SB 1496(SUB) (Thrasher) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/HB 953 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Nunez and others—**

**Warrants;** Specifies when arrest warrant may be issued; authorizes judge to electronically sign arrest & search warrants if certain conditions are met; provides that such warrants deemed electronically issued & signed by judge at time judge affixes his or her electronic signature to warrant. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for **CS/SB 962(SUB)** (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/SB 1442 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Regulated Industries and Senator Lee—**

**Alarm Systems;** Exempting from licensure certain employees and sales representatives of alarm system contractors; requiring a local enforcement agency to offer for sale uniform basic permit labels to contractors; requiring contractors to post an unused label in a specified place before commencing work on a low-voltage alarm system project; providing that a label is not required for the subsequent maintenance, inspection, or service of a permitted alarm system, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

*Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 973(HC)** in the Committees on Regulated Industries; and Criminal Justice*

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**CS/HB 341 (3R) by the Committee on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Representative Ingram and others—**

**Uninsured Motorist Insurance Coverage;** Provides that specified persons who elect non-stacking limitations on their uninsured motorist insurance coverage are conclusively presumed to have made informed, knowing acceptance of limitations on behalf of all insureds. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **SB 706(SUB)** (Montford) and read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**SB 736 (3R) by Senator Richter—**

**Limitations Relating to Deeds and Wills;** Providing for limitations of actions when a deed or will is on record; providing that a person claiming an interest in real property affected by amendments made in the act has until a specified date to file a claim or defense in court to determine the validity of the instrument; providing that if a claim or defense is filed within the specified period, the validity of the instrument is determined without regard to these amendments, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/SB 874 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Regulated Industries and Senator Galvano—**

**Open Parties;** Prohibiting a person from allowing a party to take place if a minor is in possession of or consuming alcohol or drugs; revising an exemption; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 390 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Dean—**

**Veterans' Organizations;** Prohibiting a business entity from advertising or holding itself out to the public as a veterans' organization or similar entity under certain circumstances; providing that an entity that violates the restrictions on advertising violates the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act; prohibiting misrepresentation as a service member or veteran and wearing military or veterans' uniform, medal, or insignia, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 580, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Hays—**

**Homeowners' Associations;** Providing grounds for disciplinary actions against community association managers; requiring associations to allow a member to use a portable device to make an electronic copy of the official records and prohibiting associations from charging a fee for such an electronic copy; requiring that a copy of an amendment to the governing documents be provided to the members within 30 days after it is recorded; providing additional circumstances for authorizing members to elect a majority of association board members, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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**CS/CS/SB 1410, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Banking and Insurance and Senator Simmons—**

**Fire Safety and Prevention;** Revising provisions relating to the authority of the State Fire Marshal; revising provisions relating to hearings, investigations, and recordkeeping duties and the authority of the State Fire Marshal; requiring the State Fire Marshal to investigate certain fires and explosions under certain circumstances; clarifying provisions relating to impersonating the State Fire Marshal, a firefighter, a firesafety inspector, or a volunteer firefighter, for which a criminal penalty is provided; providing penalties for rendering a fire protection system required by statute or by rule inoperative, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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### **SB 1424, 1st Eng. (3R) by Senator Evers—**

**Public Records/Personal Identifying Information/Department of Transportation or Certain Other Entities;** Providing that personal identifying information about individuals related to the payment of tolls, which is held by the Department of Transportation and certain other entities, is exempt from public records requirements; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing legislative findings and a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2013*

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### **CS/CS/CS/HB 375, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Agriculture and Natural Resources Subcommittee and Representative Roberson, K—**

**Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems;** Deletes provisions relating to development of performance criteria applicable to engineer-designed systems; revises requirements for maintenance entity service agreements for certain engineer designed-systems; authorizes certain property owners to be approved and permitted as maintenance entities for performance-based treatment systems under certain conditions; requires owners of performance-based treatment unit systems to obtain certain permits; requires systems in certain areas to comply with specified rules & standards; provides that certain systems constitute compliance with nitrogen standards; requires certain systems to meet specified standards; provides that certain systems are not required to connect to central sewer system until specified date; authorizes certain property owners to be approved & permitted as maintenance entities for aerobic treatment unit systems under certain conditions; provides requirements for such maintenance entity service agreements; prohibits manufacturers from denying certain septic tank contractors access to aerobic treatment unit system training & parts; authorizes certain replacement parts for aerobic treatment unit systems; requires aerobic treatment unit system owners to obtain permits. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

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### **CS/SB 1014 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Garcia—**

**Public Records/ Participants in Treatment-based Drug Court Programs;** Exempting from public records requirements information from the initial screenings for participation in a treatment-based drug court program, substance abuse screenings, behavioral health evaluations, and subsequent treatment status reports regarding a participant or a person considered for participation in a treatment-based drug court program; providing for future repeal and legislative review of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

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### **CS/CS/CS/SB 1734 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Criminal Justice and Senator Flores—**

**Public Records/Victims of Human Trafficking;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for criminal history records of victims of human trafficking expunged under s. 943.0583, F.S.; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Read the second time on April 24, 2013*

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### **SB 1848 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Simmons)—**

**Public Records/Inspector General/Citizens Property Insurance Corporation;** Providing a public records exemption for the identity of individuals who make certain allegations or provide certain information to the inspector general of Citizens Property Insurance Corporation and for information relating to a resulting investigation; providing for future review and repeal; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1770 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.

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### **SB 1850, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Simmons)—**

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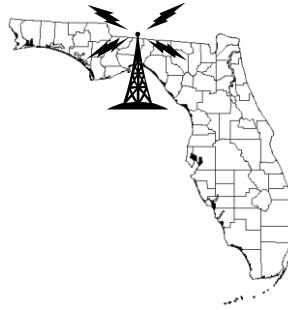
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
