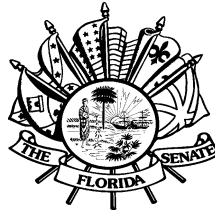

BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 964, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Abruzzo—

Termination of Parental Rights; Providing that a parent's rights may be terminated if the court determines, by clear and convincing evidence, that the child was conceived during an act of unlawful sexual battery; creating a presumption that termination of parental rights is in the best interest of the child if the child was conceived as a result of an unlawful sexual battery; requiring the court to accept a guilty plea or conviction as conclusive proof that the child was conceived by a violation of criminal law, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2013, and applies to all unlawful acts of sexual battery occurring before, on, or after that date.

CS/HB 7065, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations Committee, State Affairs Committee, Representative Caldwell and others—

Everglades Improvement and Management; Revises legislative findings for achieving water quality goals; revises definition of term "Long-Term Plan"; revises provisions for use of certain ad valorem tax proceeds; directs SFWMD to complete specified analysis; revises provisions for collection of agricultural privilege tax; provides for use of such tax proceeds; provides that payment of such tax & certain costs fulfills certain constitutional obligations; provides appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Substituted for CS/SB 768(SUB) (Simpson) and read the second time on April 24, 2013

CS/SB 1302 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Garcia—

Temporary Certificates for Visiting Physicians; Providing that a physician who has been invited by certain medical or surgical training programs or educational symposiums may be issued a temporary certificate for limited privileges solely to provide educational training; modifying criteria; revising the requirements for proof of medical malpractice insurance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 24, 2013

CS/CS/CS/SB 1734 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Criminal Justice and Senator Flores—

Public Records/Victims of Human Trafficking; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for criminal history records of victims of human trafficking expunged under s. 943.0583, F.S.; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 24, 2013

CS/CS/HB 1393 (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Agriculture and Natural Resources Subcommittee and Representative Beshears—

Agricultural Storage and Shipping Containers; Authorizes use of certain brands & marks on containers used for storage & transport of agricultural & other commercial products to designate & distinguish ownership of containers; provides requirements for sale & purchase of specified number of plastic bulk merchandise containers; provides that prosecuting attorneys may inspect records of purchase at any time upon reasonable notice; provides criminal & civil penalties; provides exception for operator of waste management facility & certain tax-exempt entities. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 654(SUB)** (Montford) and read the second time on April 25, 2013*

CS/CS/HB 713 (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Agriculture and Natural Resources Subcommittee, Representative Pigman and others—

Water Quality Credit Trading; Authorizes DEP to implement water quality credit trading in adopted basin management action plans; deletes requirement that voluntary trading of water credits be limited to Lower St. Johns River Basin; revises provisions relating to rulemaking for water quality credit trading programs. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for **CS/SB 754(SUB)** (Grimsley) and read the second time on April 25, 2013*

CS/CS/SB 848 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Gardiner—

Spaceport Territory; Revising spaceport territory for purposes of the Space Florida Act to include certain property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

*Similar to **CS/HB 135(HC)** in the Committees on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; Community Affairs; and Appropriations*

CS/HB 695 (3R) by the Committee on Business and Professional Regulation Subcommittee and Representative Holder—

Tied House Regulation; Authorizes Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of DBPR to impose administrative sanctions for violations of specified provisions of Beverage Law under certain circumstances; prohibits licensees from possessing or using certain coupons for malt beverages; removes provision prohibiting distributors of beer from furnishing certain coupons to consumers. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for **CS/SB 864(SUB)** (Thrasher) and read the second time on April 25, 2013*

HB 7015 (3R) by the Committee on Civil Justice Subcommittee, Representative Metz and others—

Expert Testimony; Provides that witness qualified as expert by knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education may testify in form of opinion as to facts at issue in case; requires courts to interpret & apply principles of expert testimony in conformity with specified U.S. Supreme Court decisions; subjects pure opinion testimony to such requirements; provides that facts or data that are otherwise inadmissible may not be disclosed to jury by proponent of opinion or inference unless court determines that probative value of facts or data in assisting jury to evaluate expert's opinion substantially outweighs prejudicial effect. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1412(SUB)** (Richter), read the second time, and amended on April 25, 2013*

SB 1852, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Negron)—

Funding from the National Mortgage Settlement; Providing an appropriation from the General Revenue (GR) Fund to the Florida Prepaid Tuition Scholarship Program to purchase 2-year dormitory residence advance payment contracts for certain students; providing an appropriation from the GR Fund to the state courts system to provide technology solutions to expedite foreclosure cases through the judicial process; providing an appropriation from the GR Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to provide legal aid services to low- and moderate-income homeowners facing foreclosure; providing an appropriation from the GR Fund to the Department of Economic Opportunity to provide a grant to Habitat for Humanity of Florida for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: Upon the deposit of \$200,080,474 into the General Revenue Fund from the escrow account created as a result of the consent judgment entered into by the Attorney General on April 4, 2012, in the case of United States of America, et al. v. Bank of America Corp., et al., No. 12-0361-RMC, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

CS/CS/SB 1472, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, Senator Legg and others—

Nuclear and Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle Power Plants; Modifying an alternative cost recovery mechanism for the recovery of costs for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants; establishing a procedure and requirements for cost recovery based on preconstruction and construction phases; providing that a utility that elects not to complete construction of a nuclear power plant may not recover or retain any rate of return for related costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

CS/SB 606 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Gibson and others—

Northeast Florida Regional Transportation Commission; Creating the commission; providing for transportation projects of regional significance; exempting the commission from taxes or assessments; specifying that the commission is not an authority for purposes of specified provisions relating to a discretionary tax, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/CS/HB 333 (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Veteran and Military Affairs Subcommittee, Agriculture and Natural Resources Subcommittee, Representative Steube and others—

Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; Revises definition of terms "navigation rules," "resident" or "resident of Florida," & "resident alien"; exempts specified persons participating in certain outdoor recreational events from requirements for hunting & fishing licenses & permits; revises number of days that commission may designate as free fishing days each year; revises requirements for restricted species endorsement on saltwater products license; deletes provisions for periodic adjustments of certain fees based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 448(SUB) (Dean) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/HB 347, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Business and Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Representative Renuart and others—

Alcoholic Beverages; Revises provisions with respect to licensure & operation of distilleries; provides requirements for craft distilleries; provides for sale of distilled spirits by licensed distilleries under certain conditions; provides reporting requirements; prohibits shipment of certain distilled spirits; prohibits transfer of distillery license under certain conditions; prohibits craft distillery from having its ownership affiliated with another distillery under certain conditions; provides requirements relating to payment of taxes; provides for applicability; provides rulemaking authority; provides that county commission may order election on sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises under certain conditions. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 642(SUB) (Hays) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/CS/HB 701 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Healthy Families Subcommittee, Representative Smith and others—

Electronic Benefits Transfer Cards; Prohibits EBT cards from being accepted in certain locations or for certain activities. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

Substituted for CS/SB 1048(SUB) (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/CS/HB 489 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Stone and others—

Railroad Police Officers; Authorizes temporary appointment of special officers who meet certain qualifications; requires special officers employed by railroad or other common carrier to have specified qualifications & meet specified continuing training or education requirements; provides that Class I, II, or III railroad is considered an "employing agency" for specified purposes & shall pay costs associated with training & continuing education; provides for reclassification of certain offenses committed against railroad special officer. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/SB 1110(SUB) (Evers) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/SB 1372, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bradley—

Pretrial Detention; Providing additional factors a court may consider when ordering pretrial detention; requiring a court considering whether to release a defendant on bail to determine whether the defendant is subject to registration as a sexual offender or sexual predator and, if so, to hold the defendant without bail until the first appearance on the case; providing an exception, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

Compare to **HB 7035(HC)** in the Committees on Judiciary; Criminal Justice; Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and Appropriations

CS/SB 1420 (3R) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Sobel—

Mental Health Treatment; Authorizing forensic and civil facilities to order the continuation of psychotherapeutics for individuals receiving such medications in the jail before admission; providing timeframes within which competency hearings must be held; revising the time for dismissal of certain charges for defendants that remain incompetent to proceed to trial; standardizing the protocols, procedures, diagnostic criteria, and information and findings that must be included in an expert's competency evaluation report, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/HB 1147 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee and Representative Fitzenhagen—

Office of Attorney General; Revises Legal Affairs Revolving Trust Fund with regard to which funds are required to be transferred to General Revenue Fund unallocated; provides that rewards for reporting Medicaid fraud shall be paid from Operating Trust Fund; revises obsolete dates; revises duties of Department of Legal Affairs relating to manufacturer certification of dispute-settlement procedures; provides notice requirements for certain manufacturers seeking renewal of certification or ceasing operation of certified procedure; revises notice requirements relating to rejection of dispute by department; authorizes, rather than requiring, office to bring an action for complaints involving discriminatory housing practices. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for **CS/SB 1464(SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/SB 1664, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Legg—

Education; Revising the requirements of State Board of Education rule for uniform core curricula for state-approved teacher preparation programs; authorizing a qualified private provider to seek approval to offer a competency-based certification program; requiring the board to adopt rules that allow an individual who meets specified criteria to be eligible for a temporary certificate in education leadership; renaming the Florida Teachers Lead Program as the Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/SB 1150, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senators Benacquisto and Brandes—

Governmental Accountability; Providing that each public agency contract for services must meet specified requirements; revising provisions relating to the Chief Financial Officer's intergovernmental contract tracking system under the Transparency Florida Act; providing that contracts awarded pursuant to an invitation to bid shall be awarded to the responsible and responsive vendor that submits the lowest responsive bid; requiring the Chief Financial Officer to perform audits of executed contract documents and to discuss such audits with the agency officials, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

HB 7143 (3R) by the Committee on Government Operations Subcommittee and Representative Cummings—

OGSR Direct-support Organization for Department of Veterans' Affairs; Saves from scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act exemption from public records & public meetings requirements for information identifying certain donors to DSO for DVA; specifies applicability of public meeting exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

Substituted for **CS/SB 474(SUB)** (Altman) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/SB 490, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulated Industries, Judiciary and Senator Stargel—

Landlords and Tenants; Revising exclusions from applicability of the Florida Residential Landlord and Tenant Act; providing that the right to attorney fees may not be waived in a lease agreement; providing that attorney fees may not be awarded in a claim for personal injury damages based on a breach of duty of premises maintenance; revising and providing landlord disclosure requirements with respect to security deposits and advance rent; providing examples of conduct for which the landlord may not retaliate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

Similar to CS/HB 77, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Judiciary; Regulated Industries; and Rules

CS/HB 413 (3R) by the Committee on Health Quality Subcommittee, Representatives Hutson, Campbell and others—

Physical Therapy; Authorizes physical therapist to implement physical therapy treatment plans of specified duration which are developed by physical therapist or provided by practitioner of record or ARNP. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/SB 536(SUB) (Detert) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/SB 634 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Simpson—

Motor Vehicles; Revising provisions relating to the operation of radios or other soundmaking devices in vehicles; deleting a standard for determining prohibited sound levels; deleting an exception for vehicles operated for business or political purposes; authorizing local authorities to regulate the place where such soundmaking devices may be operated, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/HB 649 (3R) by the Committee on Energy and Utilities Subcommittee and Representative Cummings—

Public Records/Proprietary Confidential Business; Provides exemption from public records requirements for specified proprietary confidential business information held by electric utility that is subject to ch. 119, F.S., in conjunction with due diligence review of electric project or project to improve delivery, cost, or diversification of fuel or renewable energy resources; provides for retention of such information for specified time; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/SB 714(SUB) (Simmons) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/HB 1223, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Representatives Grant, Spano and others—

Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices; Authorizes civil penalty for person who willfully uses deceptive or unfair trade act or practice against military servicemember or servicemember's spouse or dependent child in certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/SB 716(SUB) (Simpson) and read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/HB 655 (3R) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee, Representative Precourt and others—

Political Subdivisions; Prohibits political subdivisions from requiring employers to provide certain employment benefits; prohibits political subdivisions from requiring, or awarding preference on basis of, certain wages or employment benefits when contracting for goods or services; provides for applicability & future repeal of certain ordinances; conforms provisions to constitutional requirements relating to state minimum wage. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 726(SUB) (Simmons), read the second time, and amended on April 25, 2013

CS/SB 824 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Garcia—

Public Records/Forensic Behavioral Health Evaluation; Creating an exemption from public records requirements for a forensic behavioral health evaluation filed with a court; providing a definition for the term "forensic behavioral health evaluation"; providing a statement of public necessity, applicability, and construction, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/SB 834, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Simmons—

Public Records/Proprietary Business Information/Office of Insurance Regulation; Creating an exemption from public records requirements for proprietary business information submitted to the Office of Insurance Regulation; defining the term "proprietary business information," etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2013, if SB 836 or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

SB 986 (3R) by Senator Soto—

Requirements for Driver Licenses; Including notice of the approval of an application for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals status issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services as valid proof of identity for purposes of applying for a driver license, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

*Identical to **HB 235, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committees on Transportation; Judiciary; and Rules*

CS/CS/SB 1016 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Policy and Senator Hays—

Dentistry; Prohibiting a contract between a health insurer, a prepaid limited health service organization, or a health maintenance organization and a dentist from requiring the dentist to provide services at a fee set by the insurer or the organization under certain circumstances; requiring a contract with a governmental contractor for health care services to include a provision for a health care provider licensed under ch. 466, F.S., as an agent of the governmental contractor, to allow a patient or a parent or guardian of the patient to voluntarily contribute a fee to cover costs of dental laboratory work related to the services provided to the patient without forfeiting sovereign immunity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/HB 833 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee and Representative Passidomo—

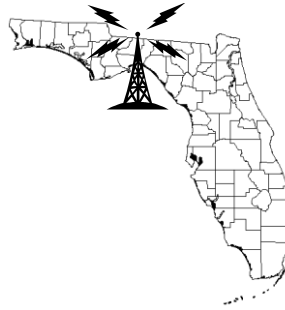
