Economic Business Incentives; Revising the sales tax exemption for certain business purchases of industrial machinery and equipment; deleting certain limitations on, and procedural requirements relating to, the exemption; deleting the sales tax exemption for machinery and equipment used for certain federal procurement contracts; deleting the limitation on the maximum amount of tax refunds a business may receive under the qualified defense contractor and space flight business tax refund program and the maximum amount of tax refunds a business may receive under the tax refund program for qualified target industry businesses, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, and except for this section which shall take effect upon becoming law, this act shall take effect January 1, 2014.

CS/SB 916 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Flores and others—

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Specifying a period during which the sale of clothing, wallets, bags, school supplies, personal computers, and personal computer related accessories are exempt from the sales tax, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1384 (2R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Judiciary and Senator Galvano—

Nursing Home Litigation; Providing that a claim for punitive damages may not be brought unless there is a showing of admissible evidence proffered by the parties which provides a reasonable basis for recovery of punitive damages when certain criteria are applied; requiring the trier of fact to find by clear and convincing evidence that a specific person or corporate defendant actively and knowingly participated in intentional misconduct or engaged in conduct that constituted gross negligence and contributed to the loss, damages, or injury suffered by the claimant before punitive damages may be awarded, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

CS/SB 1468 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Lee—

Appointment of an Attorney for a Dependent Child with Disabilities; Requiring an attorney to be appointed in writing; requiring that the appointment continues in effect until the attorney is permitted to withdraw or is discharged by the court or until the case is terminated; requiring that the attorney be adequately compensated for his or her service; providing a limitation; providing for a conditional implementation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably
