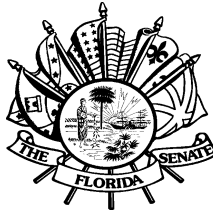

CS/CS/SB 1138 (MR) by the Committees on Judiciary, Agriculture and Senator Evers—

Civil Liability of Farmers; Expanding an existing exemption from civil liability for farmers who gratuitously allow a person to enter upon their land for the purpose of removing farm produce or crops left in the field after harvesting to include farmers who gratuitously allow a person to enter upon their land to remove any farm produce or crops, etc.
Effective Date: 07/01/2014

CS/CS/SB 586, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Altman—

Brownfields; Revising legislative intent with regard to community revitalization in certain areas; revising procedures for designation of brownfield areas by local governments; providing procedures for adoption of a resolution; providing requirements for notice and public hearings; authorizing local governments to use a term other than "brownfield area" when naming such areas; providing an exemption from liability for property damage for entities that execute and implement certain brownfield site rehabilitation agreements; providing for applicability, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Read the second time and amended on April 11, 2014

CS/CS/SB 850, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Legg—

Education; Requiring a school that includes certain grades to include information, data, and instructional strategies in its school improvement plan; revising the kind of lab schools that receive a proportional share of the sparsity supplement; requiring a district school board, in consultation with the district school superintendent, to make CAPE Digital Tool certificates and CAPE industry certifications available to students, including students with disabilities, in prekindergarten through grade 12, to enable students to attain digital skills; authorizing district school boards to execute a contract with a state university or certain independent colleges and universities to establish the collegiate high school program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Read the second time and amended on April 11, 2014

CS/CS/SB 764 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Detert—

Hearsay; Providing that certain statements are an exception to the hearsay rule and thus admissible, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read the second time on April 23, 2014, and read the third time on April 24, 2014

CS/SB 1726 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Sobel)—

Crisis Stabilization Services; Requiring the Department of Children and Families to develop standards and protocols for the collection, storage, transmittal, and analysis of utilization data from public receiving facilities; requiring the department to require compliance by managing entities by a specified date; requiring the department to create a statewide database, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/CS/CS/SB 602 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Ethics and Elections and Senator Latvala—

Residency of Candidates and Public Officers; Requiring a candidate or public officer required to reside in a specific geographic area to have only one domicile at a time; providing factors that may be considered when determining residency; providing exceptions for active duty military members; specifying the applicability of residency requirements on the Governor and Cabinet officers; specifying that the act does not apply to members of the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2015

CS/CS/HB 287 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Innovation Subcommittee, Representatives Artiles, Williams, A. and others—

Certificates of Need; Decreases subdistrict average nursing home bed occupancy rate goal that AHCA is required to maintain as goal of its nursing-home-bed-need methodology; provides that replacement of a nursing home or relocation of beds is health-care-related project subject to expedited review; prohibits agency from approving application for new community nursing home beds under certain circumstances; repeals provisions relating to moratorium on approval of certificates of need for additional community nursing home beds. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 268(SUB) (Grimsley) and read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/CS/HB 409 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Passidomo and others—

Offenses Against Vulnerable Persons; Revises when out of court statement by elderly person or disabled adult is admissible in certain proceedings; expands application of prohibition on fraudulent use of personal identification information of specified victims without consent to include persons 60 years of age or older; deletes requirement that property of elderly person or disabled adult be obtained by deception or intimidation in order to constitute exploitation of such person; specifies additional circumstances that constitute breach of fiduciary duty & specifies when unlawful appropriation occurs; creates presumption that certain inter vivos transfers are result of exploitation; provides exceptions; provides for jury instructions concerning presumption; revises valuation of funds, assets, or property involved for various degrees of offenses of exploitation of elderly person or disabled adult; provides for return of property seized from defendant to victim before trial in certain circumstances; conforms provisions. Effective Date: 10/01/2014

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 588(SUB) (Richter) and read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/CS/HB 633, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee, Representative Ingram and others—

Division of Insurance Agents & Agency Services; Revises name of Division of Insurance Agents & Agency Services; revises original appointment & renewal fees related to certain insurance representatives; provides requirements relating to agents in charge; prohibits an insurance agency from conducting insurance business at certain locations; revises licensure requirements & penalties; revises requirements relating to applications for insurance agency licenses; revises scope of examination for limited agent; requires department to suspend certain licenses & appointments; revises prohibition against unlicensed transaction of life insurance; revises requirements for licensure of nonresident surplus lines agents; revises qualifications for approval as mediator; authorizes DFS to adopt rules; prohibits persons seeking to be licensed by division from denying or failing to acknowledge certain expunged or sealed records. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Substituted for CS/SB 1210(SUB) (Bean) and read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/SB 1238, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Family Trust Companies; Citing this act as the "Florida Family Trust Company Act"; providing for the calculation of kinship; exempting a family trust company or foreign licensed family trust company from licensure; specifying the maximum number of designated relatives allowed for a family trust company and a licensed family trust company; requiring that licensed family trust companies procure and maintain fidelity bonds or specified minimum capital account and errors and omissions insurance; prohibiting certain activities on the part of family trust companies, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2015, if SB 1320 or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law

CS/CS/HB 523 (3R) by the Committees on Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee, Business and Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Representatives Grant, Steube and others—

Licensure to Carry a Concealed Weapon or Firearm; Authorizes approved tax collectors to accept applications for licenses to carry concealed weapons or firearms; provides for tax collectors to be authorized to accept applications for licenses to carry concealed weapons or firearms; provides for memoranda of understanding between approved tax collectors & DOACS; provides for remission of revenue to DOACS; provides for retention of specified fees by tax collectors; prohibits tax collectors from maintaining certain lists; prohibits persons from receiving compensation for handling such applications unless authorized. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Pub. Rec./Payment of Tolls and Associated Charges; Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information obtained from payment of tolls & associated charges; provides for retroactive application of exemption; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Substituted for CS/SB 616(SUB) (Evers) and read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/SB 1140 (3R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Hays—

Public Records/Division of Emergency Management/Emergency Planning; Creating an exemption from public records requirements for information furnished to the Division of Emergency Management by a person or business for the purpose of obtaining assistance with emergency planning; providing for retroactive application of the exemption; providing for future repeal and legislative review of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Read the second time on April 23, 2014

CS/CS/SB 1526 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Thrasher—

Public Records/Department of Legal Affairs; Creating an exemption from public records requirements for information received by the Department of Legal Affairs pursuant to a notice of a data breach or pursuant to certain investigations; authorizing disclosure under certain circumstances; defining the term "proprietary information"; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1524 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

CS/SB 414 (3R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Dean—

Public Records/Animal Researchers; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of certain animal researchers at public research facilities, including state universities; providing for retroactive applicability of the exemption; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Public Records/Yellow Dot Critical Motorist Medical Information Program; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of participants in a yellow dot critical motorist medical information program; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 262 or similar legislation authorizing the governing body of a county to create a yellow dot critical motorist medical information program takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

CS/HB 313 (3R) by the Committee on Choice and Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Diaz, M and others—

Single-Gender Public School Programs; Provides requirements for district school board when establishing gender-specific elementary, middle, or high school; requires school administrative & instructional personnel to participate in professional development; provides accountability requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

CS/HB 525 (3R) by the Committee on Business and Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Representatives Grant, Steube and others—

Pub. Rec./Personal Identifying Information/Licensure to Carry Concealed Weapon or Firearm; Provides exemption from public records requirements for certain personal identifying information held by tax collector when individual applies for license to carry concealed weapon or firearm pursuant to s. 790.06, F.S.; provides for retroactive application of exemption; provides for disclosure of such information under specified conditions; provides for legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: On the same date that HB 523 or similar legislation takes effect

Substituted for CS/SB 546(SUB) (Simpson) and read the second time on April 24, 2014

CS/CS/HB 783, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee, Representative Albritton and others—

Motor Vehicle Sales; Prohibits affiliated finance company from taking specified actions relating to certain finance obligations arising from vehicle contract that contains third-party provider's specified automotive related product; provides factors to determine whether automotive related product is similar in nature, scope, & quality to automotive related product offered for sale by affiliated finance company or its related manufacturer or wholesale distributor; provides that violation does not constitute criminal offense. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 832(SUB) (Flores) and read the second time on April 24, 2014

**HB 7177 (3R) by the Committee on State Affairs
Committee and Representative Brodeur—**

OGSR/Prescription Drug Monitoring Program; Revises provisions relating to public record exemption for certain information held by DOH pursuant to prescription drug monitoring program; specifies that certain entities may disclose confidential & exempt information in certain instances if such information is relevant to active investigation; requires certain steps to ensure continued confidentiality of nonrelevant confidential & exempt information before disclosure of such information; authorizes DOH to disclose relevant information, rather than requiring DOH to disclose confidential & exempt information; saves exemption from repeal. Effective Date: 10/01/2014

**CS/SB 828, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on
Judiciary and Senator Bradley—**

Court System; Repealing provisions relating to a prohibition on the practice of law by a retired justice of the Supreme Court; repealing provisions relating to the appointment and duties of a Clerk of the Supreme Court; repealing provisions relating to compensation of the Marshal of the Supreme Court; excluding retired judges practicing law from the Conference of Circuit Judges of Florida; removing a requirement that circuit court judges attend and participate in such conference; revising the number of members of the Judicial Qualifications Commission to conform to requirements of the State Constitution; repealing provisions relating to an evidentiary rule regarding evidence of title to land passing from the United States, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Labor Pools; Revising methods by which a labor pool is required to compensate day laborers; requiring a labor pool to provide certain notice before a day laborer's first pay period; specifying requirements for a labor pool that selects to compensate a day laborer by payroll debit card; authorizing a labor pool to deliver a wage statement electronically upon request by the day laborer, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

**CS/HB 1047 (3R) by the Committee on Health and
Human Services Committee, Representative Adkins
and others—**

Termination of Pregnancies; Revises circumstances under which pregnancy in third trimester may be terminated; authorizes administrative discipline for violation of certain provisions by certain licensed professionals; requires physician to perform certain examinations to determine viability of fetus; prohibits abortion of viable fetus outside of hospital. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

**CS/CS/SB 1274, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on
Community Affairs, Banking and Insurance and

Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Postponing the date that certain major structures become ineligible for coverage by the corporation; providing that a condominium association is ineligible for commercial residential wind-only coverage under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

**CS/HB 785, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on

Workers' Compensation; Providing that oral vitamins, nutrient preparations, dietary supplements, and certain medical food are not reimbursable; authorizing employers to negotiate the retrospectively rated premium with insurers under certain conditions; providing requirements for the filing and approval of such plans and associated forms; providing requirements for insurers engaging in the negotiation of premiums with eligible employers; providing construction with respect to the passage of similar legislation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

**CS/CS/HB 755 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary

Family Law; Provides for consideration of time-sharing schedules or time-sharing arrangements as factor in adjustment of awards of child support; authorizes judges in family cases to take judicial notice of certain court records without prior notice to parties in certain circumstances; provides for deferred opportunity to present evidence; requires notice of taking such judicial notice to be filed within specified period; provides that term "family cases" has same meaning as provided in Rules of Judicial Administration; creates an exception to prohibition against using evidence other than verified pleading or affidavit in an ex parte hearing for temporary injunction for protection against domestic violence, repeat violence, sexual violence, dating violence, or stalking. Effective Date: 10/01/2014

CS/HB 609 (3R) by the Committee on Civil Justice Subcommittee, Representative Wood and others—

Article V Constitutional Convention; Establishes qualifications of delegates & alternate delegates to Article V constitutional convention; provides for appointment of delegates by Legislature; authorizes Legislature to recall delegate & fill vacancy; authorizes presiding officers to call special legislative session to carry out certain provisions relating to appointments; requires delegates to sign oath; provides for instructions to delegates; establishes circumstances under which convention vote is declared void; provides circumstances under which delegate's appointment is forfeited; establishes circumstances under which application to call Article V convention ceases to be continuing application & is deemed to have no effect; provides penalties; establishes delegate advisory group. CS/HB 781 (3R) by the Committee on Civil Justice Subcommittee, Representative Powell and others—

Legal Notices; Requires legal notices to be posted on newspaper's website on web pages with specified titles; prohibits charging fee or requiring registration for viewing online legal notices; establishing period for which legal notices are required to be published on statewide website; requires that legal notices be archived on statewide website for specified period; deletes provision relating to harmless error; clarifies payment provisions. Effective Date: 10/01/2014
