**State Employees;** Providing for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the state and certified bargaining units of state employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

**State-administered Retirement Systems;** Revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

**Impact Fees;** Revising the minimum requirements for impact fees adopted by a local government; exempting water and sewer connection fees from the Florida Impact Fee Act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

**CS/CS/SB 234 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary,  
Infrastructure and Security and Senator Baxley—**

**Registration and Titling of Vehicles and Vessels;** Revising registration periods for certain vehicles; requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to prorate registration renewals for customers in order to implement changes made by the act; authorizing the department or its agent to verify necessary information through the electronic file of death records maintained by the Department of Health for a surviving spouse of a motor vehicle owner when requesting a registration certificate and license plate transfer, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2019
