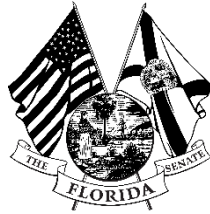

### **CS/SB 292 (3R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space and Senator Lee—**

**Education;** Prohibiting a district school board from prohibiting a student from lawfully wearing the uniform of any of the Armed Forces of the United States or of the state at his or her graduation ceremony, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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### **SB 7050 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance (Broxson)—**

**OGSR/Investigations and Examinations by the Office of Financial Regulation;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for information collected in connection with investigations and examinations by the Office of Financial Regulation of the Financial Services Commission; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

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### **SB 648 (3R) by Senator Mayfield and others—**

**Continuing Education for Dentists;** Requiring a licensed dentist to complete a minimum of 2 hours of continuing education on the prescribing of controlled substances biennially, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Identical to **HB 549(HC)** in the Committees on Health Policy; Innovation, Industry, and Technology; and Rules*

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### **CS/CS/CS/SB 1080 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Criminal Justice, Senator Book and others—**

**Hazing;** Expanding the crime of hazing, a third degree felony, to include when a person solicits others to commit or is actively involved in the planning of hazing; expanding the crime of hazing, a first degree misdemeanor, to include when a person solicits others to commit or is actively involved in the planning of hazing; providing that a person may not be prosecuted if certain conditions are met, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

*Read the second time on April 17, 2019*

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### **CS/CS/SB 7030, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Infrastructure and Security, and Education (Diaz)—**

**Implementation of Legislative Recommendations of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission;** Requiring sheriffs to establish a school guardian program or contract with another sheriff's office that has established a program under a certain condition; requiring the Office of Safe Schools to annually provide training for specified personnel; requiring district school boards and school district superintendents to partner with security agencies to establish or assign safe-school officers; revising requirements for school district zero-tolerance policies; requiring the Florida Safe Schools Assessment Tool (FSSAT) to be the primary site security assessment tool for school districts, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

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### **CS/CS/SB 7040 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Ethics and Elections (Baxley)—**

**Financial Disclosure;** Requiring the Commission on Ethics to procure and test an electronic filing system by a certain date; requiring certain forms to be filed electronically beginning on a specified date; providing that the commission is not liable for the release of certain information under certain circumstances; requiring the commission to redact certain information under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

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### **CS/SB 7042 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Ethics and Elections (Baxley)—**

**Public Records/Commission on Ethics;** Providing exemptions from public records requirements for secure login credentials held by the Commission on Ethics and certain information entered into the electronic filing system for financial disclosure forms; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 7040 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

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**SB 7048 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Book)—**

**Disclosure of Confidential Records;** Requiring service providers to disclose information from a clinical record under certain circumstances relating to threats to cause seriously bodily injury or death; requiring, rather than authorizing, psychiatrists to disclose certain patient communications for purposes of notifying potential victims and law enforcement agencies of certain threats; requiring, rather than authorizing, psychologists to disclose certain patient and client communications for purposes of notifying potential victims and law enforcement agencies of certain threats; providing psychologists with immunity from specified liability and actions under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

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**HB 5303 (3R) by the Committee on Government Operations and Technology Appropriations Subcommittee and Representative Williamson—**

**Child Support Enforcement;** Revises requirement that DOR pay federally required annual fee for public assistance cases involving certain individuals. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

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**HB 5401 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee and Representative Raschein—**

**Department of Environmental Protection;** Transfers specified powers & duties of FWCC relating to environmental crimes to Division of Law Enforcement within DEP; provides for DEP & FWCC memorandum of agreement; provides for reassignment of personnel & retention of benefits; establishes Division of Law Enforcement within DEP; provides specified authority to DEP & FWCC officers; provides for deposit of proceeds in specified DEP trust funds; appoints DEP representative to Joint Task Force on State Agency Law Enforcement Communications; authorizes certain use of Inland Protection Trust Fund moneys; provides penalties for false personation & unlawful use of badges & other symbols of DEP officers. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

**Relief of Dominguez by Hillsborough County;** Providing for the relief of Jorge L. Dominguez, Chelsea Beatrice Dominguez, Brittny Delores Dominguez, and Tori Alexis Dominguez by Hillsborough County; providing for an appropriation to compensate them for the wrongful death of Darcia Lynn Dominguez, which occurred as the result of the negligence of Hillsborough County and one of its employees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Report submitted by the Special Master on Claim Bills; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 6525(HC) in the Committees on Judiciary; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules*

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**CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 76 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Innovation, Industry, and Technology, Infrastructure and Security, Senator Simpson and others—**

**Driving While Using a Wireless Communications Device;** Prohibiting a person from operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless communications device; authorizing a law enforcement officer during a specified period to stop motor vehicles to issue warnings to persons who are driving while using a wireless communications device; providing that a user's billing records for a wireless communications device or the testimony of or written statements from certain authorities are admissible as evidence in crashes involving serious bodily injury, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2019

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**CS/SB 7068 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Infrastructure and Security (Lee)—**

**Transportation;** Creating the Multi-use Corridors of Regional Economic Significance Program within the Department of Transportation; specifying that projects undertaken in the corridors are tolled facilities and certain approved turnpike projects, and are considered as Strategic Intermodal System facilities; requiring the department to identify certain opportunities to accommodate or colocate multiple types of infrastructure-addressing issues during the project development phase; providing specified requirements that must be met before project construction in any identified corridor is eligible for funding, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**CS/SB 354 (SO) by the Committee on Education and Senator Montford—**

**Immunization Registry;** Revising provisions relating to the communicable disease prevention and control programs under the Department of Health; establishing that a certain student who obtains a vaccination from a Florida college or university student health center may refuse to be included in the immunization registry; revising school-entry health requirements to require students to have a certificate of immunization on file with the department's immunization registry, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2021

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/SB 426 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Flores and others—**

**Firefighters;** Granting certain benefits to a firefighter upon receiving a diagnosis of cancer if certain conditions are met; requiring an employer to make certain disability payments to a firefighter in the event of a total and permanent disability; providing for death benefits to a firefighter's beneficiary if a firefighter dies as a result of cancer or cancer treatments; adjusting the allocation of funds to provide line-of-duty death benefits for members in the investment plan of the Florida Retirement System, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**SB 446 (SO) by Senator Mayfield and others—**

**Coastal Management;** Revising the criteria the Department of Environmental Protection must consider in determining and assigning annual funding priorities for beach management and erosion control projects; revising the ranking criteria to be used by the department to establish certain funding priorities for certain inlet-caused beach erosion projects; revising requirements for the comprehensive long-term management plan; requiring the plan to include a strategic beach management plan, a critically eroded beaches report, and a statewide long-range budget plan, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2019

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**SB 530 (SO) by Senator Brandes and others—**

**Alcohol or Drug Overdose Prosecutions;** Prohibiting the arrest, charge, prosecution, or penalization under specified provisions of a person acting in good faith who seeks medical assistance for an individual experiencing, or believed to be experiencing, an alcohol-related overdose; prohibiting the arrest, charge, prosecution, or penalization under specified provisions of a person acting in good faith who seeks medical assistance for an individual experiencing, or believed to be experiencing, a drug-related overdose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 732 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Health Policy and Senator Flores—**

**Clinics and Office Surgery;** Requiring the Department of Health to deny or revoke the registration of or impose certain penalties against a facility where certain office surgeries are performed under certain circumstances; authorizing the department to issue an emergency order suspending or restricting the registration of a certain office if it makes certain findings; requiring a physician who performs certain office surgery and the office in which the surgery is performed to maintain specified levels of financial responsibility, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**CS/SB 920 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Pizzo—**

**DNA Database;** Revising legislative findings relating to the use of the DNA database, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 122 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Banking and Insurance, Senator Broxson and others—**

**Insurance Assignment Agreements;** Providing requirements and limitations for property insurance assignment agreements; providing that an acceptance by an assignee of an assignment agreement is a waiver by the assignee and its subcontractors of certain claims against an insured; authorizing insurers to make available property insurance policies restricting the assignment of post-loss benefits under certain conditions; providing that residential or commercial property insurance policies may not prohibit the assignment of post-lost benefits, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

**Relief of Robert Alan Smith by Orange County;** Providing for the relief of Robert Alan Smith by Orange County; providing for an appropriation to compensate Mr. Smith for injuries and damages he sustained as a result of the negligence of an employee of Orange County, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law
