BILLS ON THIRD READING

HB 7061 (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means Committee, Representative Payne and others—

Taxation; Revises provisions addressing tourist development taxes; ad valorem taxes; documentary stamp taxes; convention development taxes; severance taxes; sales & use taxes; & corporate income taxes; provides criminal penalties for certain violations; provides sales tax exemption for items that assist in independent living; deletes provisions relating to state funding for sports facility development under certain circumstances; provides sales tax holidays for specified items.
Effective Date: 07/01/2021

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR FRIDAY, APRIL 30, 2021

CS/SB 506 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Garcia—

Transparency in Government Spending; Requiring nongovernmental entities that have received a specified amount of state funds to submit an annual report detailing certain compensation data to the Department of Management Services; requiring such reports to be verified under penalty of perjury; requiring the department to post the information received through such reports on a specified website; requiring a nongovernmental entity to post the reported compensation information on its website; prohibiting a governmental entity from expending, transferring, or distributing funds to a nongovernmental entity if compliance with reporting requirements is not met, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1570 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Rodriguez—

Quasi-public Entities; Requiring the Governor to specify affiliated departments for certain quasi-public entities by a certain date; requiring a quasi-public entity to maintain a website that includes certain information; prohibiting a quasi-public entity from using public funds to retain a lobbyist; requiring the Auditor General to compile a list of quasi-public entities and submit the list to the Governor, the Legislature, and the Legislative Auditing Committee by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

RESOLUTIONS TO BE ADOPTED BY PUBLICATION ON FRIDAY, APRIL 30, 2021

SR 2076 (SR) by Senator Gruters—

Sarasota County Day; Recognizing May 14, 2021, as “Sarasota County Day” in Florida in honor of the 100th anniversary of the creation of Sarasota County, etc.

SR 2078 (SR) by Senator Farmer and others—

Janet Frohlich Lizbeth Mabry; Celebrating the legacy of strength and kindness of Janet Frohlich Lizbeth Mabry and her contribution to the Florida legislative process, etc.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 92 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Bean—

Department of Children and Families; Requiring the department to establish community alliances in each community-based care lead agency service area; requiring the department to treat caregivers in a specified manner; requiring, rather than authorizing, each community-based care lead agency to establish a kinship navigator program; requiring a board member or an officer of a managing entity to disclose specified activity that may reasonably be construed as a conflict of interest; requiring lead agencies to publish on their websites certain information related to case managers' caseloads within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 200 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Berman and others—

Student Retention; Authorizing a parent or guardian to request that his or her K-5 student be retained in a grade level for academic reasons for a specified school year; requiring school principals to consider such requests if they are timely received; requiring a school principal who considers a request for retention to inform the student's teachers of the request and collaboratively discuss with the parent or guardian any basis for agreement or disagreement with the request; requiring a parent or guardian to sign a form provided by the principal indicating the parent or guardian's decision and acknowledging the academic and athletic ramifications of their decision, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 390 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Wright—

Prescription Drug Coverage; Authorizing the Office of Insurance Regulation to examine pharmacy benefit managers; revising the entities conducting pharmacy audits to which certain requirements and restrictions apply; authorizing the office to require health insurers to submit to the office certain contracts or contract amendments entered into with pharmacy benefit managers; requiring certain health benefit plans covering small employers to comply with certain provisions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 1186 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Community Affairs and Senator Brandes—

Property Assessments for Elevated Properties; Specifying that changes to elevate certain homestead and nonhomestead residential property, respectively, do not increase the assessed value of the property; requiring property owners to provide certification for such property; prohibiting certain areas from being included in square footage calculation, etc. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by SJR 1182 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, if such amendment to the State Constitution is approved at the general election held in November 2022 or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 1488 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Stargel—

Public Records/Members of the Legislature; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain identifying and location information of current members of the Legislature and the spouses and children of such legislators; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1560 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Ausley—

Broadband Internet Service; Revising the duties of the Florida Office of Broadband within the Department of Economic Opportunity; requiring the office's strategic plan to include short-term and long-term goals and strategies for increasing the availability of and access to broadband Internet service in this state; requiring the office to develop geographic information system maps in collaboration with specified entities and consistent with certain federal reporting standards by a specified date; creating the Broadband Opportunity Program within the office, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1574 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Banking and Insurance and Senator Brandes—

Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Revising the method for determining the amounts of potential surcharges to be levied against policyholders under certain circumstances; specifying a limit for agent commission rates; providing that eligible surplus lines insurers may participate, in the same manner and on the same terms as an authorized insurer, in depopulation, take-out, or keep-out programs relating to policies removed from Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 1606 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Rodriguez and others—

Victims of Communism; Establishing November 7 as the Victims of Communism legal holiday; requiring the Legislature to annually observe a moment of silence in observance of the victims of communism; requiring high school students in a United States Government course to receive certain instruction on "Victims of Communism Day", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1672 (2R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Diaz—

State University Free Seat Program; Creating the State University Free Seat Program; providing an exemption from tuition and fees, including lab fees, for one online course at a state university for certain resident students; prohibiting a state university from charging such students more than a specified percentage of the tuition rate and the tuition differential under certain circumstances; providing a limitation on the application of such tuition discount, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1798 (2R) by Senator Perry and others—

Higher Education; Requiring a state university to waive the tuition and fees for certain courses in which certain resident students are enrolled; prohibiting the reporting of tuition and fees waived for state funding purposes; providing that a state university is ineligible for a specified performance-based incentive for failure to comply, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 7052 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust Fund/Department of Education; Creating the Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust Fund within the Department of Education; providing the purpose of the trust fund and the source of funds; exempting the trust fund from the general revenue service charge; requiring any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year to remain in the trust fund and be available for carrying out the purpose of the trust fund; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 48 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is enacted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

CS/SB 7062 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Environment and Natural Resources (Brodeur)—

Central Florida Water Initiative; Ratifying specified rules relating to the Central Florida Water Initiative, for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule exceeding any specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase in regulatory costs; requiring the department, in consultation with specified water management districts, to adopt rules that include an annual drought allocation for supplemental irrigation for agricultural uses and a process for examining an agricultural user's supplemental irrigation needs as weighed against certain factors; establishing, subject to appropriation, a Central Florida Water Initiative grant program within the department; requiring the department to give funding priority to certain projects relating to the Central Florida Water Initiative, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 7076 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Regulated Industries (Hutson)—

Gaming Enforcement; Creating the Florida Gaming Control Commission within the Office of the Attorney General; requiring the Commission on Ethics to accept and investigate any alleged violations of the standards of conduct for commissioners and employees; designating the Florida Gaming Control Commission as the state compliance agency having authority to carry out certain responsibilities; transferring all powers, duties, functions, records, offices, personnel, associated administrative support positions, property, pending issues, existing contracts, administrative authority, administrative rules, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, and other funds of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation related to certain responsibilities to the commission by a type two transfer, effective on a specified date; revising the definition of the term "contraband article", etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 7078 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Regulated Industries (Hutson)—

Public Records and Public Meetings/Florida Gaming Control Commission; Specifying that any exempt or confidential and exempt information obtained by the Florida Gaming Control Commission retains its exempt or confidential and exempt status; providing an exemption from public meetings requirements for portions of meetings of the Florida Gaming Control Commission wherein exempt or confidential and exempt information is discussed; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 7076 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 7080 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Regulated Industries (Hutson)—

Requirements for Pari-mutuel Permitholders to Conduct Racing or Games; Revising the application requirements for an operating license to conduct pari-mutuel wagering for a pari-mutuel facility; prohibiting greyhound permitholders from conducting live racing; authorizing jai alai permitholders, harness horse racing permitholders, and quarter horse racing permitholders to elect not to conduct live racing or games; specifying that certain permitholders that do not conduct live racing or games retain their permit and remain pari-mutuel facilities; revising requirements for a limited intertrack wagering license, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2021, but only if SB 7076 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law
