There is hereby appropriated for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, \$1,092,554 in nonrecurring funds from the Emergency Preparedness and Assistance Trust Fund to the Executive Office of the Governor, Division of Emergency Management, for county emergency management program grants which were not reimbursed prior to the end of the fiscal year due to emergency activations. This section is effective upon becoming a law.		852
