	AGENCY
1.	DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS From the funds in Specific Appropriation 657, \$34,504,901 in general revenue funds is provided to the Department of Corrections to ensure all general revenue public worksquads are maintained. The Department of Corrections shall, before eliminating any general revenue funded public worksquad officer positions, shall submit its proposal to the Governor's Office of Policy and Budget and the chairs of the Senate Appropriations Committee and the House Appropriations Committee for review and approval.
2.	From the funds in Specific Appropriation xxx, \$1,000,000 of general revenue funds shall be placed in reserve. After the Department of Corrections' successful statewide implementation of the electronic time and attendance system identified in chapters 2010-152 and 2011-69, Laws of Florida, the department may submit a budget amendment in accordance with all applicable provisions of chapter 216, Florida Statutes, requesting release of the funds.
3.	STATE ATTORNEYS/PUBLIC DEFENDERS The Prosecution Coordination Office's budgeting, legal, training and education needs may be funded by each State Attorney's office within the funds provided in Specific Appropriations 858 through 1008. Funding for this office shall not exceed \$450,000 \$400,000 from the State Attorney's Revenue Trust Fund.
4.	The Public Defenders Coordination Office's budgeting, legal, training and education needs may be funded by each Public Defender's office within the funds provided in Specific Appropriations 1009 through 1120. Funding for this office shall not exceed \$450,000 \$400,000 from the Indigent Criminal Defense Trust Fund. In addition, each Public Defender Office must submit on a quarterly monthly basis the caseload report developed by the FPDA.
5.	From the funds in Specific Appropriation, \$323,000 in recurring general revenue funds shall be used by the Justice Administrative Commission to contract with attorneys selected by the Guardian ad Litem to represent dependent children with disabilities in, or being considered for placement in, skilled nursing facilities. Attorney fees shall not exceed \$4,500 per child per year and due process costs shall not exceed \$5,000 per year per child. Funds anticipated to be in excess of those necessary to represent these children may be used for attorney training on legal issues involving children with disabilities.
6.	Proviso for Line 3182 is inclusive of lines 3182 through 3194. "Funds in Specific Appropriation 3182 to 3194, any expenditure for maintenance and repair of state-owned district court of appeal facilities shall be allocated according to a distribution plan approved by the Chief Justice."

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 1128 through 1152, in order to maximize the number of filled beds and reduce the number of vacant beds in their programs statewide, the Department of Juvenile Justice shall use economies of scale in each judicial circuit when procuring residential bed contracts. In addition, the department shall ensure that educational services are consolidated commensurate with the effort to maximize filled beds. In order to maximize cost savings, the consolidation must include educational services in neighboring counties or where department facilities are within 30 miles of each other. In making these determinations, the department shall consider the type of program and level of commitment. Finally, the department must report their program consolidation results to the Governor's Office of Policy and Budget and the chairs of the Senate Appropriations Committee and the House Appropriations Committee by January 1, 2014.
