In order to implement Specific Appropriation 1626 of the 2013-2014 General Appropriations Act and notwithstanding sections 161.041, 161.055 and 373.427, Florida Statutes, and any rules implementing those sections, existing joint coastal permits for projects identified in the proviso following Specific Appropriation 1626 which expire during the 2013-2014 fiscal year are extended until the completion of said projects, to take advantage of time-sensitive full federal emergency funding for sand losses and to address 2012 storm damages to the state's beaches.
