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3 Section XX. In order to implement Specific Appropriation 2789
4 of the 2015-2016 General Appropriations Act, section 110.12301,
5 Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

6 110.12301 Competitive procurement of postpayment claims review
7 services.—The Division of State Group Insurance is directed to
8 competitively procure:

9 (1) Postpayment claims review services for the state group
10 health insurance plans established pursuant to s. 110.123.
11 Compensation under the contract shall be paid from amounts
12 identified as claim overpayments that are made by or on behalf of
13 the health plans and that are recovered by the vendor. The vendor
14 may retain that portion of the amount recovered as provided in the
15 contract. The contract must require the vendor to maintain all
16 necessary documentation supporting the amounts recovered, retained,
17 and remitted to the division; and

18 (2) A ~~contingency-based~~ contract for dependent eligibility
19 verification services for the state group insurance program;
20 however, compensation under the contract may not exceed historical
21 claim costs for the prior 12 months for the dependent populations
22 disenrolled as a result of the vendor's services. The division may
23 establish a 3-month grace period and hold subscribers harmless for
24 past claims of ineligible dependents. The Department of Management
25 Services shall submit budget amendments pursuant to chapter 216 in
26 order to obtain budget authority necessary to expend funds from the
27 State Employees' Group Health Self-Insurance Trust Fund for payments
28 to the vendor as provided in the contract.

29 Section XX. The amendment to s. 110.12301(2), Florida Statutes,
30 shall expire on July 1, 2016, and the text of that subsection shall
31 revert to that in existence on June 30, 2015, except that any
32 amendments to such text enacted other than by this act shall be
33 preserved and continue to operate to the extent that such amendments
34 are not dependent upon the portions of text which expire pursuant to
35 this section.
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
