SUMMARY STATEMENT

Sheriff Israel set forth his denials, defenses, and position in detail in his Response to the Governor's Bill of Particulars, which Response is incorporated by reference. The testimony and exhibits will demonstrate that the allegations in Executive Order 19-14 and the Governor's Bill of Particulars are false or otherwise do not establish that Sheriff Israel neglected his duties as Sheriff or has otherwise exhibited incompetence. The evidence will show there was no lack of effective policies and

procedures in place prior to, and during the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood Airport shooting incident and the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School shooting incident. The evidence will show that Sheriff Israel and the Broward Sheriff's Office engaged in widespread and persistent training of Broward Sheriff's Office deputies and employees prior to, during, and after the subject incidents on a variety of issues, including active shooter/killer procedures and crisis intervention. The evidence will show that the Broward Sheriff's Office under Sheriff Israel's leadership was certified by CALEA and CFLEA as representing the highest standards in law enforcement practices. The evidence will show that the policies, practices, and procedures of the Broward Sheriff's Office during Sheriff Israel's leadership were routinely examined and evaluated by professional police organizations and were never found to be wanting or inadequate. The evidence will show that the Broward Sheriff's Office Active Shooter procedures and training in effect during Sheriff Israel's leadership were consistent with Florida and national law enforcement standards.

The sum total of the evidence will demonstrate that Sheriff Israel did not neglect his duties and was not incompetent.
