SB 1122: PROTECTION OF HISTORICAL MONUMENTS AND MEMORIALS

This bill takes away the power from democratically elected local governments by preempting them from being able to remove confederate monuments and statutes. It also punishes local government's who do remove or destroy monuments by making them liable to the costs of restoring the monuments to its original condition.

As I shared in committee, this is a personal attack to the City of Jacksonville and my constituents! We are not remembering history as it was during the confederacy - we are remembering a time when people in power during reconstruction intentionally built these statutes with hate and violence in their hearts.
